School Safety 101: Getting back to the basics of school safety and violence prevention in post-pandemic education.

School Safety 101 is an online, on-demand professional development course designed for educators and other school stakeholders. Through videos, readings, and application activities, this course explores the need for a proactive, educator-focused approach to school safety that is research-based, all hazards, and based in best practices.

Course Objectives:

1. To provide educators and other school stakeholders with critical information about preventing and responding to crisis incidents in schools.
2. To provide educators and other school stakeholders with practical action items that they can initiate or implement to ensure a safe and supportive environment
3. To empower educators and other school stakeholders to advocate for the implementation of best practices in violence prevention and crisis management in every school.

Course Description:

School Safety 101 is an online, on demand overview of foundational concepts in school safety and violence prevention. The course consists of four modules:

Module 1 - What is the state of school safety in today's schools?

Module 2 - Prevention, not just response: How do we make school safety part of the way we do things in our school?

Module 3 - How to effectively respond to crisis events in schools

Module 4 - Where do we go from here? Improving safety in your school

Each module is structured around three required and three optional components:

1. Activate prior knowledge pre-test. REQUIRED
2. Access the module content consisting of several short videos that provide the critical concepts of the course. REQUIRED
3. Explore supporting resources and information that builds upon the module's concepts, providing a greater level of understanding and support. OPTIONAL
4. Apply the concepts to a specific school or organization. OPTIONAL
5. Evaluate and reflect post-assessment. REQUIRED
6. Plan for improvement by creating action items to initiate and advocate for change. OPTIONAL
