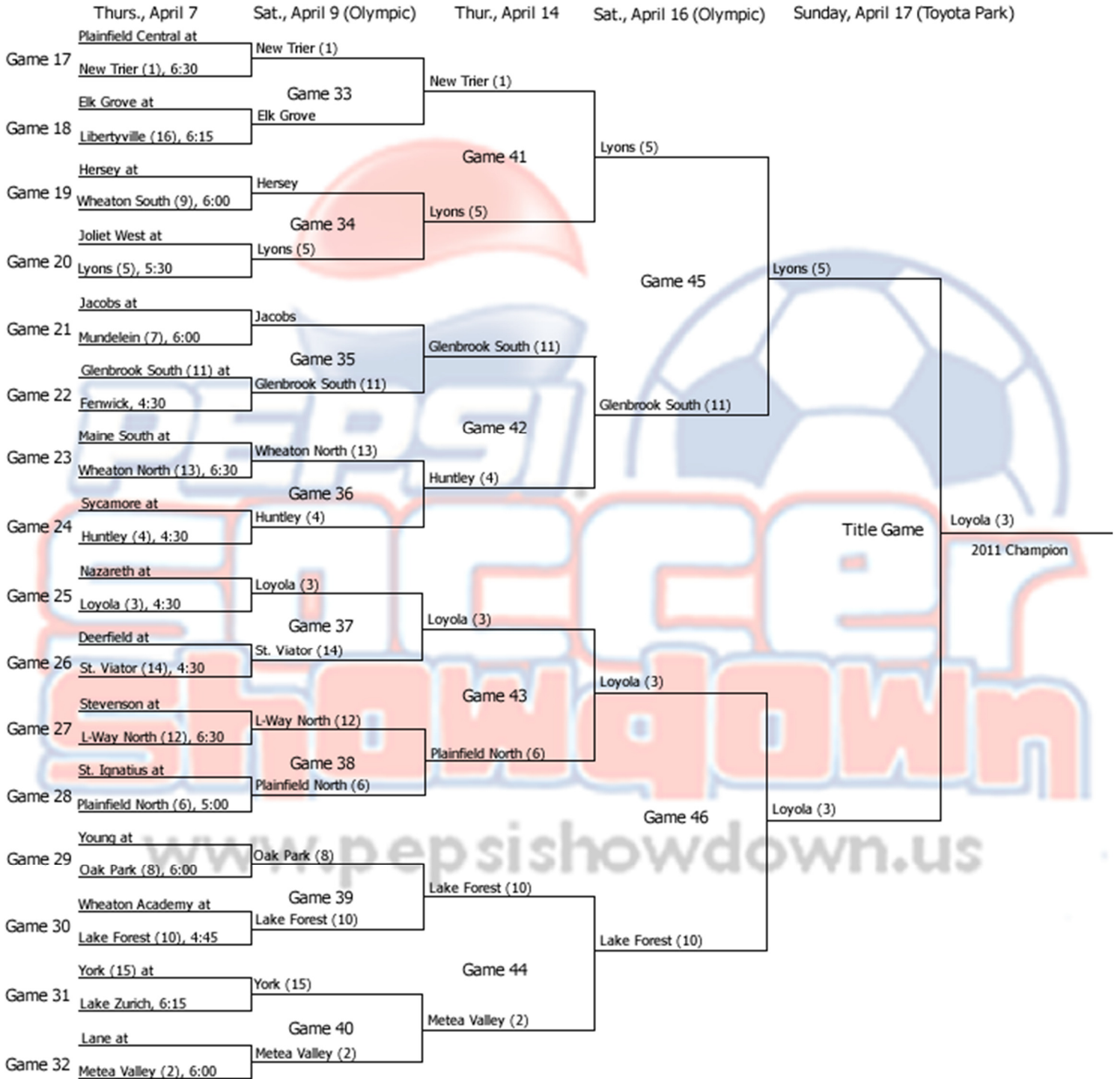

Carly Stevens, Loyola, G, sr. – In the five games prior to the title game, she posted four shutouts, allowed just one goal and stopped three consecutive penalty kicks in the Ramblers' quarterfinal win.

2011 All-Tournament Team

Maggie Orlowski, Lyons, G, jr. – After allowing a goal to Lake Forest in the tournament opener on April 5, the junior recorded four consecutive shutouts to help the Lions advance to the title game.

Keeley Nolan, Glenbrook South, D, jr. – Had big games against Huntley and Lyons, keying the Titans' current streak of 566 minutes since they last allowed a goal in regulation or overtime.

Bre Burry, Huntley, M, sr. – One of the best center midfielders in the two-week showcase recorded one goal and three assists.

Rita Craven, Lincoln-Way North, M, jr. – Two goals against Plainfield North and Warren and one assist in a win over Stevenson helped her land a spot on this squad.

Julie Govedarcia, St. Ignatius, M, sr. – Whether it's defending or attacking, her composure and vision stood out. She finished with one goal and three assists.
