

Veterans Issues - *The Mask of War*

The Mark of War is an intimate portrait of seven men who served in the Vietnam War, drawn by a psychoanalyst-filmmaker who explores their lives before going off to war, their experiences fighting in Vietnam, and their lives since their return. The feature-length documentary (75 minutes) is a reflection on the experience of war and what it does to those who are sent.
