Exotic Emperor Tulip - 10 for \$15

Among the earliest flowering Tulips, Emperor Tulips descend from Tulip fosteriana, a wild species from Central Asia. They are known for their large, colorful flowers on strong stems that are perfect for garden display and stunning bouquets. Sometimes called White Valley, it opens creamy ivory-white and matures to milky-white with yellow flames and exterior petals with emerald green striations. It is the prized double sport of White Emperor, discovered by Willem Vink. It is a strong, robust variety that stands up well to spring rains and wind. Double early tulips are known to be good for forcing. [Plant 6"- 8" deep and 6" apart. Tulip Class: Double Early. Bulb size: 12cm/up. Mid-April. Horticultural Zone: 3-8. Height: 20".]



Muscari Armeniacum - 10 for \$7.50

Known as Blue Grape Hyacinths for their form and sweet, grapes fragrance, deer-resistant Muscari naturalize well with a succession of flowering stems. They are wonderful planted in thick borders along garden beds, in front of taller plants, or in meandering rivers of blue. Considered to be the original Blue Grape Hyacinth, *M. armeniacum* is one of the most prolifically planted bulbs of all time. A native of Turkey, circa 1878, it yields one to three conical racemes of densely packed, electric cobalt blue florets with narrow white rims above full foliage clumps. [Plant 5" deep and 3" - 4" apart. Bulb size: 9 cm/up. April/May. Horticultural Zone: 4-8. Height: 6".]



"Purple Sensation" Allium - 10 for \$15

Latin for garlic, Flowering Onions are rabbit, rodent, and deer resistant, and adored by bees, butterflies, and pollinators. They extend the Spring season with a dramatic presence, after which many varieties stand as dried seed orbs. They require full sunlight and rich, well-draining soil with a neutral pH. *Allium aflatunense* Purple Sensation has 4" - 5" wide violet purple globes of starry florets. Wonderful in borders and for cutting. Excellent dried flower heads. Allium must be planted outdoors in the fall after the soil has cooled down to around 55°F (normally after two weeks of night time temperatures hovering around 40°F). [Plant 6" - 8" deep and 8" - 10" apart. Bulb size: 12 cm/up. May/June. Horticultural Zone: 4-8. Height: 24" - 30".]
