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Asian Pop-Up Cinema Season 14 is here!

Inspired by Activist Angela Davis' quote: "Walls turned sideways are bridges", we continue building this "bridge" of Asian culture appreciation through our bi-annual film festivals as we enter the 3rd year of pandemic. Running between March 13 to April 10, 2022, Season 14 will popup in downtown Chicago and the north suburbs, including Niles and Wheeling.

Handpicked for you are twenty-eight (28) new films made by filmmakers from Canada, France, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea and Taiwan - with a strong mix of uncompromising, genrebending films highlighting our common humanity. Eight (8) of them are made by emerging and seasoned woman filmmakers covering diverse subject matters that are both thought provoking and educational.

Korean star power from Choi Min-sik (Oldboy) and Park Hae-il (War of The Arrows) will open Season 14 (March 13 at AMC Niles 12) with the Midwest Premiere of HEAVEN: IN THE LAND OF HAPPINESS from Im Sang-soo, director of The Housemaid (2010) and The President's Last Bang. 'Heaven' is about a journey of two terminally ill men making a heart-throbbing finale of their lives.

This season's Centerpiece film is the festival's first North and South American Continental Premiere, Japan's ARC (April 3 at AMC River East 21). Based on the short story written by award winning author of speculative fiction Ken Liu (The Paper Menagerie), this fantasy and sci-fi feature film is directed and written by Kei Ishikawa (GUKOROKU –Traces of Sin) and co-written by Kaori Sawai. ARC follows the story of a woman who finds immortality while working with BodyWerks, a technology that plasticizes dead bodies and eventually transforms the way we look at eternal life.

The Closing film is Taiwan's North American Premiere of WAITING FOR MY CUP OF TEA (April 10 at AMC River East 21). Adapted from one of Phoebe Jan Fu-hua's best-selling novels with the same title, Phoebe Jan is making this her first directorial work. This love story stars popular boy band artist (SpeXial) and TV actor Simon Lien in his feature film debut.

We can't wait to see you online or at the cinemas.



This heartwarming comedy brings hope and inspiration to those down on their luck and reminds us that when we step up to help others, we end up helping ourselves.



Jina is the top employee at a call center, but despite talking to customers all day, she has shut out the world beyond her headset; she lives alone, eats alone, sleeps alone, and her cell phone is her constant companion. One day she's tasked with training a friendly and naive new hire, her icy armor is threatened. At the same time, she must navigate an incessantly ingratiating new neighbor, and increasingly urgent phone calls from her father, leaving Jina teetering on the edge of an existential crisis, forcing her to confront why she has isolated herself all these years.

Riffing on the Korean 'honjok' – a phenomenon of young people who live alone and skirt social interaction – to examine the personal traumas of loss and alienation, this subtly poetic directorial debut is a "stirring portrait of the cages we build for ourselves and questions how and when we may want to be free of them," Ms. Magazine.



While responding aptly to public demand for her next book, she senses a growing concern about single females her age, and is constantly being asked: "Will you be single forever?"

A live adaptation of Mari Okazaki's Manga, "Will I Be Single Forever?" Director Momoko Fukuda challenges Japan's definition of what's normal and puts the spotlight on her elaborated characters fighting for emancipation.

His father is a prominent composer, and his younger half-brother is a genius music composer. Due to the success achieved by his father and half-brother, Saku Urushibara has an inferiority complex. He tries to stay away from music because of this, but he ends up enrolling at the University of Arts in Kyoto where his special ability helps him find his own voice in the world of contemporary classical music.

While classical music is highlighted in most of Japanese cinema, this is one of the rare films depicting young people exploring their interests and composition efforts in creating experimental and new music. This film was selected specially to honor New Music fans in the U.S.

Joshua, a shy middle-aged Filipino immigrant, has lived in the comfort of his parents' home his entire life. As their health declines he longs for a partner, terrified of being alone after they pass.

"Islands is one of those films, like Percy Adlon's "Sugarbaby" (1985), about a dead soul coming to life. Looking at Joshua, we know that something has to change — that fate needs to throw a monkey wrench his way. You could say that he suffers from social anxiety disorder, and a lesser film would probably have diagnosed him that way and set about solving the problem. But Joshua has a personality he can't just change out of like a suit. That's the film's quietly authentic fascination: What does it look like, truly, when an unmolded lump of humanity wakes up? Rogelio Balagtas has never been an actor before, but his performance is exacting, and touching, in its casual repression. He shows you the prison this man is living in just because of who he is." While permanent theatres are commonly built in most cosmopolitan modern cities, Hong Kong preserves a unique theatrical architecture, a Chinese tradition that has lasted more than a century – Bamboo Theatre. It is a makeshift, open-air and bamboo shed theatre, which is built and fixed by plastic straps, without any heavy-duty materials. During festivities in the villages, Chinese opera troupes perform ritualistic operas in the temporary theatres constructed in front of the temples, in order to express their gratitude to the Chinese gods they worship. Spirits and gods were the primary audiences. This film follows ritual practices in various villages and remote islands of Hong Kong for two years. It is a portrait of this traditional cultural space: its way of building and dismantling, and the collaborative work of troupes' performers, stage managers and wardrobe, etc. It allows audiences to observe multiple corners of the space, and the variety of ways in which people make use of it.



Founded by international film and cultural curator Sophia Wong Boccio, SOPHIA'S CHOICE (蘇菲亞的精選) is a Chicago-based 501 C(3) not-for-profit cultural organization incorporated in May, 2015. Our vision is to foster an appreciation for diverse Asian culture. We realize our vision through a multi-pronged mission to:

Cultivate an interest in and understanding of Asian cultures via a diverse offering of Asian films;

By hosting one event at a time, each APUC selected film and its filmmaker receive their own spotlight, resulting in a more meaningful dialogue with the audience and media. Based on the filmmaker's availability, we also collaborate with other professional and academic institutions nationally and internationally to create outreach opportunities such as encore screenings, classroom lectures, panel discussions and industry networking, ensuring their visits to Chicago are as fulfilling as possible for both the filmmakers and the city.

Year 2022 will see us continuing with our online offerings hosted by a customized "virtual cinema" supported by a special grant from the Arts Work Fund.
