Vocational Training

Reporting: SOEUR Sokunthea

1. Sewing

Staff in charge: Ms. MARCH Samphas

Highlights:

- One new student named P T was enrolled into the program. After graduation from NYEMO, she was accepted into our VT class. (Crisis case, any detail please see social work report)
- 6 students have dramatically improved their sewing ability (teacher's report)
- Over 70% of student behavior has changed positively (teacher's report)
- 35 uniform sets were made by students in VT program
- We obtained 1 new client: Action to End Exploitation
- Previous clients renewed our services: Who Will Organization and Asian Hope Organization.

Challenges

- Some students have recurring family issues that prevent them from attending class regularly.
- P.S. refused to attend the course after 2 weeks participation due to family wishes – she was required to look after other children at home.
- Many of our students work night shifts to earn extra money, so they come to our classes tired.
- When we had extra orders, students were unable to help the trainer because they had to go home to their families
- There are only a few strong students in the sewing class – therefore we had to outsource the making of some uniforms to 2 former students. This is good as they were able to earn some extra money, but we would like to prepare the department for rush orders so that in the future we do not have to outsource.
- Many of the women are still learning how to sew. This month, there were a few issues with the uniforms (size, etc) so we missed the deadline.
- On Thursday mornings we teach Life Skills to VT students. This month we were only able to teach 1 session due to urgent tasks.

Activities for Next Month

- Sew 100 uniform for RKF's students (budget has been approved)
- Work with our Vocational Training Coordinator and volunteer from Oxfam QC to sell our uniform services to more private schools, companies and NGOs.
- Work with Vocational Training Coordinator to conduct market research for ideas about future products we can sell. Specifically, we want to learn about the demand for baby clothes.
- Speak with 15 women in our Vocational Training classes about their ideas and reflections of our program. We will take their ideas and suggestions into consideration so we can improve our program.
- Participate in monthly meeting with micro-team

Goals

- Design prototype of baby clothes to use for our marketing survey.
- Urgent tasks are unexpectedly popping up; however the Thursday morning Life Skills sessions are very important. We want to teach at least 2 sessions a month.
- Working with the women who need additional help sewing so we do not have to outsource our jobs in the future.

- Floods may have prevented some students from attending classes regularly

Financial Training Seminar

Reporting: SOEUR Sokunthea

Highlights

- Students from the Get Ready Boys and Get Ready Girls classes attended the 1st part of a 4 series workshop on Financial Management.
- The participants started to understand how to take notes about their daily expenses and plan ahead about their income and finances.
- Students were taught the importance of managing money.
- The participants were given a “Beginner Budget” kit that included a calculator, notebook, ruler and pen.
- Students were keen to participate and eager to share their experiences.

Challenges

- Some of the students only know how to write numbers, but cannot form sentences.
- The speaker does not speak Khmer, so a translator was needed.
- Participants are from different groups (Get Ready programs, Vocational Training Program) so the level of difficulty had to be modified.
- Some participants understood the lesson quicker than others.

Next Month

- Continue with the 2nd lesson of the program.

Highlights

- Worked with foreign volunteer to improve reporting process
- Updated Inventory report to make it more accurate
- Created program Inventory Reports to better manage and stay within budget.
- Micro-department earned a profit of \$ 657.25 from handcraft products and school uniforms
 - \$ 27 from handcraft product sales
 - \$ 97 from facilitating 2 women in VT cycle. One made uniforms for 2 partner NGO (transportation and service)
 - \$ 533.25 from uniform sales to Who Will Organization
- There are 103 sets of uniforms remaining in stock
 - XL = 13 (Female: 8)
 - L = 28 (Female: 12)
 - M = 31 (Female: 12)
 - S = 31 (Female: 19)

Challenges:

- Organizational shifts and staff responsibilities were changed suddenly, so we were very busy trying to keep up with deadlines, tasks, etc.
- We missed weekly and monthly meetings normally held with the women in Vocational Training, due to all the changes

Plans for next Month

- Conduct monthly meeting with women in vocational training on the 1st week of October.

Highlights

- 6 clients paid back part of their loan.

Challenges:

- KK, TP, KS, KS, NN, OS, JM, PS, HS, SH, LC and SS asked to delay returning their loans because they need money for Pchum Ben day in October
- SM ask to delay loan repayment, because she need money for the delivery of her daughter’s baby
- HS stopped working at Cambodiana and asked to delay loan repayment to this month
