Report on the Baby Bellies Programme

The highlights of the programme for the month of January 2012 are

- Providing milk to six children thereby improving their overall nutrition intake.
- Educating the mothers about keeping themselves and their children hygienic.
- Educating the mothers on good child care practises.
- Emphasising the need for school and education and encouraging the mothers to send their children to school.

The keys challenges faced during this period are

- Educating the mothers on the importance and the need for leaving the children under proper adult care and supervision. It has been observed that many mothers have the practise of leaving the children at home alone.

- To pay attention to the babies with health problems, to monitor and to report the progress.
- To work with the social workers in order to educate all the mothers on the necessity and importance of basic health education.

- Gave cash advances
- Devised a complete work plan with Mr. Sophea
- Held meetings with Sophal and Srey Ya to discuss matters such as absence of the children in the centre.
- Made arrangements to provide milk to all the children
- Held meetings with the house mothers in each of the centre to discuss how to take care of the hygiene and safety of the children and the staff, how to provide for the food and clothes to the kids, how to stop all kinds of violence.
- Joined in the Doorstep meetings
- Educated the house mother and the children on how to improve the overall hygiene
- Check the hygiene conditions in each classroom
- Prepared agendas for the weekly meetings
- Visited seven sick children and two sick house mothers
- Visited the families in the community with the social workers
- Went to the market to buy milk and medicines
- Took the seven children and the two house mothers to the hospital
- Counselling the mother on study information and participation in the monitoring of their children
- Helped to create the child file with the case file coordinator
- Discussed with the education staff about the various issues related to children that exists at the state schools
- Did the annual report for the micro-business
- Settled the cash with the Finance
