



Riverkids Foundation School Supporting Program Monthly Report

Report for Month: January, 2013.

Main School Supporting Program Highlight:

- Tuition fees for the month of December have been paid for students who study at Toul Sangke, Ponheakrek and Little Bird.
- A girl has returned to Ponhea Krek Primary School.
- Monitored performance of students attending state and private schools.
- Transportation support and weekly tuition fees were provided to secondary and high school students.
- Seven school bags have been purchased and given to Smartypants students.
- Textbooks for Semester One have been purchased for a University student. Moreover, he has been selected to lead all students in Phsar Touch (in meeting).
- Eleven students have completed entrance tests in an external English program, at Westline Private School.
- The annual utility bill was paid in Kolap, ToulSangke and Ponheakrek.
- Monthly food support was provided to families of the Little Bird Program.
- A student who studied in Toul Sovanna Ram was transferred to Beltei (letter) and we are currently working with Ponhea Krek Primary School Director for the other students.
- Our social team has provided feedback on 20 students through Casefile Coordinator.
- 14 students (adult) participated in a three-day nursing program (HIV/AIDs) workshop.
- Two cases of girls who graduated from Get Ready were sent to our social team. One girl decided to stop attending state school and the other girl has stopped school
- A student who was reintegrated from Get Ready Boys will now be attending the boy class at Blum.
- Two students frequently attended class (last month they were truants) and one student returned to her class at Ponheakrek Primary School.

Main School Supporting Program Challenges

- We need \$1500 per term or three months to enroll ten students to study English at Westline School.
- All state schools, which we have enrolled students in, have been closed for one week. We have delayed to next new week.
- An inspector from the Education Ministry visits and evaluates teachers, school director and students' situations. Other



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people are not permitted to enter the school except students, teachers and school director.

- A girl who graduated from Get Ready Girl decided to stop attending state school and one other girl doesn't go to school.
- We are struggling to work with secondary and high school teachers and the school director, who hesitate to allow us visit in their school and class. They require a formal letter from the Interior Minister and Ministry of Education Youth and Sport (addressed to the school director).
- 12 students have come down with a fever and serious cold.
- Four students were truants.
- It is expensive to reintegrate and transfer students to secondary and high schools in city.
- Most of girls who study at secondary and high school want to find jobs more than study.
- The process of transferring letters was delayed.
- Our activities are dependent on the state school, so when they delay we do also. The state school often changes its schedule. This is a risk when we want to complete our work according to a monthly plan.

Next month's plan for Schools Scholarship:

- Pay January monthly tuition fees to students who study at Toul Sangke, Ponheakrek, and Little Bird.
- Revise four students' information at state and submit follow up student absentee form to social team.
- Monitor students who are attending all state and private schools.
- Provide transportation support and weekly tuition fees to secondary and high school students.
- Meet with Beltei, secondary, and high school students to ensure their study progresses and buy seven school bags for Beltei and text books for a University Student (\$15).
- Pay tuition fees for ESL (Beltei) students and IEP (Westline) student.
- Pay monthly food support to a family at Little Bird Program.
- Work with Ponheakrek School Director to finish processing a transfer letter and send a transfer letter to Sihanuk Will for Tach Chan Thy.
- Work with our social team for truant students.
- Meet with secondary and high school teacher and director.
- Monitor and encourage a team leader who responds to English Teaching children at Phsar Touch community.
