- Encourage parents to bring their children to the hospital by providing transportation support. If the child is admitted to the hospital, we will provide food.
- Suggest parents to inform us when their children are sick.

Routine Medical Care

Highlights

- Provided more milk to the children
- Brought pregnant women for prenatal checks at the health center
- Provided medications to patients: 93 patients (offered 122 treatments and consultations)
 - Staff: 23 (42 consultations)
 - Baby room: four babies (six consultations)
 - Weekly Boarders: four (five consultations)
 - State students: 28 students (34 consultations)
 - Get Ready: Nine (ten consultations)
 - Kindergarten: three kids (three consultations)
 - Community: eight people (eight consultations)
 - Baby belly: two babies (two consultations)
 - Micro: six people (six consultations)
 - DCA: six people (six consultations)

Challenges

- Some families were careless in keeping their children's medications
- Some community people were careless about their health
- Some community members were too lazy to approach us for consultation and wanted us to check on them at their homes
- Others broke their promises to go to the hospital with me
