## OUR PROGRAMS

### Supervised Visitation

In an effort to reunite families that have been disrupted, Parents Place provides Supervised Visitation Program. The program allows children who have been separated from their families the opportunity to maintain a relationship with their parent(s) while a permanency plan is being formulated. Children and the non-custodial parent(s) are able to spend quality time together in a safe and nurturing environment under the guidance of professionally trained staff who provide education, observation, documentation, and intervention, when necessary.

### Born Learning

Children are born learning. They are constantly learning from birth on. Families with young children understand that the early years are important, but many are unsure how to encourage early learning prior to school or think they lack the time or talent to prepare their child for school. Born Learning strives to increase knowledge of early childhood development and school readiness, acknowledging that everyday experiences children have with their caregivers are the basis for what is learned in the first 5 years and lay the foundation for all future learning.

### Community Education

Parents Place, Inc. is the coordinating agency and contract administrator of the Community Education Program, a family enrichment center. This is a resource for families with children ages 0-18 and is designed to promote strong, healthy families through support, education and shared experiences by building on family strengths. Parenting is a tough job and a tremendous responsibility. All families can benefit from sound parenting information and support that can be found in our parent support groups, education classes and workshops, children's education and support groups, playgroups, information and referral, and crisis support.
