## REFLECT ON THE GOSPEL

---

*“Those who were ready  
went into the wedding feast.”*

MATTHEW 25:10

**T**oday's parable of the ten virgins urges us to be alert and awake, ready for the time when Jesus will come again. Jesus wants to make it clear that a time will come when each person is either welcomed into heaven or finds the door barred before them. He wants to warn us so that no one gets left out.

But what's all this fuss about the virgins' supply of oil? It seems that it's the oil that determines whether we are ready to meet Jesus. We could call it our faith or the Holy Spirit or the grace of God. Whatever it is, it's something that we can't borrow from a friend. We have to be prepared with our own supply.

As frightening as this parable can seem, it can also fill us with hope. This parable tells us that anyone can be welcomed by Jesus, the Bridegroom, as long as they are alert, awake, and well supplied with the oil of salvation.

Staying alert and awake. Keeping our lamps aflame. Maintaining a good supply of oil. These are all ways of saying the same thing: Jesus wants us to keep our faith alive every single day. How can we do this? We can take our cue from St. Paul, who promised, "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

We have a prime opportunity to check our faith when we proclaim the Creed every Sunday at Mass. Actually, we can do this every day in our personal prayer. We can be sure that whenever we confess and believe, we bring a smile to God's face. Even if our faith is imperfect or incomplete, the Lord still smiles, and we can hear the angels announce, "Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!" (Matthew 25:6).

So let's proclaim our faith today. Let's fill up our oil flasks by announcing our belief in Jesus, our Savior.

***Jesus, I believe in you.***

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### *St. Elizabeth of Hungary*

**Feast Day:** November 17

**Patron Saint of** bakers, Catholic Charities, and the  
Secular Franciscan Order

As the daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth's marriage was arranged when she was just a child. At the age of 4, she was sent to Thuringia for education and eventual marriage. When she was 14, she married Louis of Thuringia. They loved each other deeply and had 3 children together.

Even though a life of leisure and luxury could easily have been hers, Elizabeth chose to live a simple life. Louis supported Elizabeth in all she did to relieve the sufferings of the poor and sick. After 6 years of marriage, Louis went to fight in the Crusades and died on the way. Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her in-laws accused her of mismanaging the finances of the kingdom, forcing her and her children out of the palace. When her husband's friends returned from the Crusades, they helped restore her to her rightful place in the palace since her son was legal heir to the throne. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died at the age of 24. She was canonized 4 years later. Elizabeth is symbolized by a triple crown—for roles as a member of royalty, as a mother, and as a saint.

## YOUCAT CORNER

### *What is hell?*

Hell is the condition of everlasting separation from God, the absolute absence of love. [1033–1037]

Someone who consciously and with full consent dies in serious sin, without repenting, and refuses God’s merciful, forgiving love forever, exludes himself from communion with God and the saints. Our freedom makes that decision possible. Jesus warns us again and again not to separate ourselves definitely from him by shutting our hearts against the need of *his* brothers and sisters: “Depart from me, you cursed... . As you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to me” (Matthew 25:41-45).

### *If God is love, how can there be a hell?*

God does not damn men. Man himself is the one who refuses God’s merciful love and voluntarily deprives himself of (eternal) life by excluding himself from communion with God. [1036–1037]

God yearns for communion even with the worst sinner; he wants everyone to convert and be saved. Yet God created man to be *free* and respects his decisions. Even God cannot compel love. As a lover he is “powerless” when someone chooses hell instead of heaven.
