

Dear Members and Friends of Holy Cross,

By God's grace, we are a people on the move! We are now well into PHASE 2 of creating our **STRATEGIC PLAN** here at Holy Cross. PHASE 1 was basically the rollout of the strategic-planning process – sharing with everyone the elements of a strategic plan and what we all were going to be a part of and creating together. PHASE 3 is still down the pike and will take place this coming fall, when we will work on tactical plans to achieve our goals.

Right now, however, we are still in the midst of PHASE 2. So far we have met together to start to draft a **vision** for our church family. Through a congregation-wide survey, we were also able to establish our **core values** – what's most important to us, what we stand for and believe in. As I write this, it is right now mid-May and we are in the midst of doing our **SWOT analysis** – assessing the particular **S**trengths, **W**eaknesses, **O**pportunities and **T**hreats that are strategically important to our church. Basically what we are trying to do with this step is help match our internal strengths, resources and capabilities with our external environment. Along with this, we want to identify our **unique advantages**: What do we do best (perhaps more so than other churches)? What unique skills, resources, gifts and capabilities has God placed in our church?



So we have basically nailed down **where we are now** – our mission, our core values and what we do best. We are zeroing in on **where we want to go** – what we want our church to look like and how we will measure success. It logically flows, then, that our next step will be looking to **fill in that gap** – between where we are now and where we want to be – with **how we are going to get there: Our strategic objectives and goals**. This is what we will be working on together in the weeks ahead and we need everybody's – meaning **YOUR** – effort, energy and input!

This is an exciting time for our congregation! You can feel the mighty winds of the Spirit blowing among us. May our good and gracious God bless us with the ability to catch those winds to His glory and for the coming of His kingdom among us!

Psalm 143:10 says: "Teach me to do Your will for You are my God! Let Your good Spirit lead me on level ground!" **Please join me in praying each day for our Lord's guidance as we seek His plan for us here at Holy Cross.**

PRESIDENT'S JOURNAL

I will be forever grateful that somewhere along the way, I paid enough attention about "warning signs" to have recognized the potential for warning signs. If you don't know the signs of stroke, heart attack, seizures or choking (to name but a few), educate yourself. When time is of the essence, you will be glad you did. Sometimes, things happen to you or those you love.

The other thing I (we) learned was how fortunate my family is to be part of the Holy Cross family. While I already knew this at some level, it was truly driven home last month. We were overwhelmed by the outpouring of prayers and support that we received, and are still receiving. That care and support was further driven home on Sunday, May 15. That Sunday, Pastor Wismar blessed the prayer shawls and quilts so lovingly made by the ladies of our Dorcas Guild.

As I looked upon the ladies' beautiful handiwork, it struck me: Our Holy Cross family had been just like those shawls. 
