One Big Thing:

The church is a Jesus-centered family on mission.

Review:

This week we discussed what it looks like to be a Jesus-centered family on mission. We used the description of the early church in Acts 2:42-47 to do this. They are described as spending time learning God’s Word, praying together, eating together, sharing everything that they had with one another, praising God, and welcoming in more people everyday who were being saved. We concluded by recognizing that the only way that we can live like this is by believing in Jesus.

Good Questions to Ask:

1. **Q:** What is the church?

A: The church is people who believe Jesus is the ultimate hero, who have been brought into God's family, and who are joining God in sharing the good news of Jesus with the world.

2. **Q:** What were some of the things that the early church was doing?

A: The early church was spending time learning God's Word, praying together, eating together, sharing everything that they had with one another, praising God, and welcoming in more people everyday who were being saved.

3. **Q:** What are some ways our family can practice what the church was doing in the Bible?

A: We can do all of the things that the early church did--have people over for dinner and play dates, pray together as a family and with other families who love Jesus, praise God, spend time with our LifeGroup, at Kidtown, and at Sunday gatherings.
