

Oregon Health Care Interpreter State Certification

A Reference Sheet Compiled by the Oregon Health Care Interpreters Association

Requirements and Costs:

1. Target language for interpreting is Arabic, Cantonese, Korean, Mandarin, Russian, Spanish, or Vietnamese
2. Minimum 18 years of age
3. Possess a valid Oregon Driver's license or valid passport
4. Not on the Medicaid Exclusion List: <http://exclusions.oig.hhs.gov/>
5. Have at least **60 hours** of formal health care interpreter training by an Oregon Health Authority approved agency
 - **Approved Training Agencies:**

 - *Program Cost:* **\$750**
 - *Format:* in person
 - *Target Languages:* language neutral

 - Cultural Advantage: Online Medical Interpreter Training Program
 - *Program Cost:* **\$750** (extra: **\$150** evaluation/mock testing session)

 - *Target Languages:* Albanian, Arabic, Japanese, Korean, Mandarin, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog

- 6. Have minimum **80 hours** of documented interpreting experience as a health care interpreter (provide employer letter or documentation of work/volunteer hours spent exclusively on health care interpreting)

- 7. Pass written and oral national certification tests from either the National Board of Certification for Medical Interpreters (NBCMI) or the Certification Commission for Healthcare Interpreters (CCHI).
 - **National Board of Certification for Medical Interpreters (NBCMI)**
 - Languages offered: Cantonese, Korean, Mandarin, Russian, Spanish, Vietnamese
 - Requirements to register for the exam:
 - Minimum 18 years of age
 - High school diploma or GED diploma
 - Successful completion of minimum 40 hours of health care interpreter training
 - *If you have worked as a health care interpreter for at least 1 year in the last 2 years for Cantonese, Korean, Mandarin, Russian, or Vietnamese, then you can submit proof with a signed letter of employment on company letterhead in place of proof of language proficiency*
 - Make sure letter includes target language, hire date, and dates of employment
 - If you don't meet the work requirement above, then you must submit proof of oral proficiency in English and the target language (described below)
 - *Proof of oral proficiency in English by one of the following:*
 - Bachelor, Masters, PhD, or any other degree from any US institution of higher education
 - Graduation from any high school in an English language country or from an American School abroad
 - One of the following tests:
 - TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): 570+ on paper; 230+ on computer version; 90+ on iBT
 - Cost TOEFL iBT: **\$190** (fees subject to change)

 - ELPT (English Language Proficiency Test): 950+
 - MELAB (Michigan English Language Assessment Battery) 80+
 - ECPE (Examination for the Certificate of Proficiency in English): PASS
 - FCE (First Certificate in English, Level 3): A
 - CAE (Certificate in Advanced English, Level 4): B
 - CPE (Certificate of Proficiency in English, Level 5): B
 - IELTS (International English Language Testing System): 7.0
 - *Proof of oral proficiency in the target language by one of the following:*
 - Bachelors, Masters, PhD, or any other degree from an institution of higher education where the target language is spoken
 - Graduation from a high school of the country where the target language is spoken
 - 24+ semester college credit hours of the target language

- *Proof of oral proficiency in the target language by **one** of the following (cont'd):*
 - ACTFL Orals Exams (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages): Advanced Mid Level
 - Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI): **\$139**
 - Oral Proficiency Interview – Computer (OPIc): **\$70**
 - Offered for limited languages
 - Website: www.languagetesting.com
 - **Note:** The NBCMI requires that all documents submitted for proof of language proficiency be translated to English; a non-certified translation is acceptable
 - Cost by a translation company: **\$27-\$100+** page
 - Costs for NBCMI Exams
 - Registration: **\$35** (free to Oregon residents who are testing in a language other than Spanish)
 - Written Exam: **\$175**
 - Oral Exam: **\$275** (**\$235** for Oregon residents who are testing in a language other than Spanish)

 - **Certification Commission for Healthcare Interpreters (CCHI)**
 - Languages Offered: Arabic, Mandarin, Spanish
 - Requirements to register for the exam:
 - Minimum 18 years of age
 - High school diploma or GED diploma
 - Successful completion of minimum 40 hours of health care interpreter training
 - Language proficiency in English and target language (provision of evidence of proficiency is not required)
 - Costs for CCHI Exams
 - Registration: **\$15 (until 12/31/15)**
 - CoreCHI written exam: **\$155 (until 12/31/15)**
 - CHI oral exam: **\$275**
