## A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR AMINA ROBINSON

Sometimes a story comes along that grabs you, penetrates your spirit, and reinvigorates your childhood memories of fire hydrants in the summer, little hug juices, quarter bags of chips from the corner store, double-Dutch, and playing outside all day on South Philly marble steps. Well, at least that is what happened to me when I read 1 Pound 4 Ounces by Khalil Munir.

Khalil's story begins with his true miracle of birth and takes us on a journey of innocence and youth, resilience, hope, love and loss within the context of growing up in South Philly. The landscape is one familiar to me, as I grew up in the same neighborhood as Khalil. This shows abides in the world of economic disenfranchisement of Black people in Philadelphia, the aftershocks of systematic disbursement of crack into Black neighborhoods and celebrates the power of a people to not only survive, but to thrive.

The overlap in my life and Khalil's is palpable. We have known one another for many years. But, far before that his grandfather Eddie Simon gave my mother her very first job, well before I was even a thought in her mind. I remember going to Mr. Eddie's corner store to get snacks and bacon for breakfast. We played in the same streets. Our fathers struggled in many of the same ways. Most interestingly, we were not in the minority in this experience. This show is very Philly. This show is very Black Philly. We receive it as a tribute to our city, to our community, to our memories, and to our legacy. This jawn is US!

Through every stage he steps on and every student he teaches, Khalil Munir continues to uplift, empower, and ignite the transformative power of performance.


