A lesson that I personally was very glad to have reinforced was how committed the Good Earth Village community is.



## **Program Director's Report**

2022 Summer Theme: Created Good "God saw all that God had made, and it was very good." Genesis 1:31

**Created to Create:** We are called to be co-creators with God. Campers explored the story of Noah and the Ark and how God calls us to create things.

**Created to Wonder:** We are called to wonder within God's creation. Campers read the story of Abram and how his descendents would be as numerous as the stars. Campers learned about the importance of having awe and wonder for God's creation.

**Created to Care:** We are called to care for all of God's creation. Campers heard the story of Jesus and the paralyzed man and learned how to follow the example Jesus gives to care for others even if we don't know them.

**Created to Flourish:** We are called to flourish as God's creation. Campers learned that God created us not to be stagnant but to flourish! The story of Jesus and the children was used to show that God wants us to flourish at every stage in our lives.

**Created to Share:** We are called to share the abundance of God's creation. The story of Jesus feeding the five thousand was used to show how we are called to share our experiences and resources to love our neighbor.

Summer 2022, allowed campers to explore God in creation, make new friends, and reflect on what God has created us to be. We were surrounded by God's beautiful creation here at camp, and it gave us countless opportunities to wonder and be in awe of God's handiwork. Campers were encouraged to love God and each other throughout their time here at camp. It is our hope that campers left this place with a renewed sense

of God's love for them and how they might live life differently knowing that they are created good.

The Go Fish! program was implemented in July. We had a cabin full of enthusiastic campers ready to learn how to fly fish. We welcomed a local fly fishing expert to come and teach our campers the basics on the first day, and from there they went on to catch many trout! The Thursday Evening

Worship this summer connected all the daily themes of Bible study. Campers moved to different locations around camp. Each location had a story skit, and an interactive station. The stations included a drawing, a guided meditation, a hand-washing blessing and an affirmation circle. Campers then had a time to reflect both personally and in their cabin group with song and prayer.

Women's Day participants gathered to hear stories from Rev. Emily Carson from the Office of the Bishop, SEMN Synod, Tharan Leopold from ELCA Churchwide and SEMN Synod, and Executive Director Dianna Parks from

Good Earth Village. Women's Day focused on the theme of "Legacy." We talked about how to build our lives around our values, how to make space for grace around our regrets, and how to release those regrets. What we leave behind is more than our stuff and our money -- we also leave a legacy of behaviors, choices, and our example. The resurrection of Jesus Christ teaches us that we can be born into a new sense of purpose and love at any time we

choose, and we can do it as often as is necessary.

Two Rekindle Fall Youth Retreats were held this year building on the summer theme. The overnight retreats welcomed campers from grades 3-12. Campers enjoyed Bible study, campfire worship, nature hikes, a challenge course and s'mores.

This year, Good Earth Village continued to provide a year-round adult program. Lunch and Learn programs are a space for adults to gather at camp for a delicious meal, time with new and old friends, and an opportunity to learn from an expert on a variety of topics. We had speakers share stories and topics such as, Sermon preparation, Norwegian travels and architecture, and Psalms and Christmas carols.

We wrapped up our program season with a pair of **Beer and Carols** events in Rochester and Chatfield. We are looking forward to the 2023 season!
