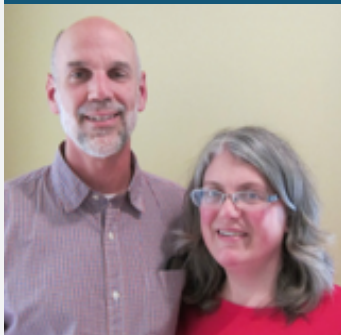
ELIJAH HORVATH
