- Every Saturday, pray that God will use His Word and Spirit to make you more rooted in Him.

#### HOW TO STUDY THE BIBLE

As you prepare to study God's Word, take a moment to stop, take a deep breath, and ask God to speak to you through His Word. This little moment of preparation reminds us that reading the Bible is a sacred act in which we invite God to speak to us.

#### 1. Read

As you read through the passage, make a note of anything that pops out to you or raises a question in you. After reading through the passage once, read through the passage once or twice more, this time thinking about what stands out in this passage and what impression it leaves on you. Reading out loud can be helpful too, as it can help us understand what we're reading and help us process each verse of the passage.

#### 2. Reflect

As you reflect on the passage, try thinking through these two questions:

- What does this passage reveal to us about God?
  - Regarding Old Testament narratives:
    - How does this narrative point me to Jesus'/God's redemptive work in history?
- What does this passage reveal to us about people?
  - Regarding Old Testament narratives:
    - Does this narrative provide a positive or negative example?

## 3. Respond

Every part of Scripture is inspired by God Himself, and a message so perfect and powerful demands a response from us. So, in light of the truth you've just read, consider these two questions:

- What's this passage calling me to do today?
  - Regarding Old Testament narratives:
    - Is there a negative example to warn me of?
    - Is there a positive example to follow?
    - How does God's redemptive work in the story move me to follow Him more closely today?
- What's this passage calling me to pray for today?

We don't expect that our lives will be radically changed every time we read our Bible. But we do know that we are becoming a more faithful people every time we open our Bibles. This is a discipline that will slowly transform us as we consistently study God's Word.
