Position Summary:

The nuučaanuł Language Worker (Part-time) will co-present language lessons alongside other language staff to Żučna Daycare with the goal of providing consistent and meaningful nuučaanuł learning opportunities to Xaʔuukwiʔatn daycare students. Outside of the classroom setting, the nuučaanuł Language Worker also provides translation and transcription support to other Xaʔuukwiʔatn departments and local organizations. They also work with our Digitization Team assisting with interviews with fluent speakers and the preservation of language materials in our digital archive.

Cultural Commitment:

The nuučaanuł Language Worker is expected to promote and integrate the cultural teachings, language, and values of Xa?uukwi?ath First Nation into all educational programs, ensuring that these are meaningful and relevant to students, families, and the community. The role requires the candidate to actively foster a learning environment that respects the heritage of the Nation while supporting the educational success of its members.

Duties and Responsibilities (include but not limited to):

- > Teaching lessons from the λa?uukwi?atḥ Language Curriculum in a daycare environment
- > Ensuring that class participants are engaged in and understanding the lesson material
- Foster and support the implementation of nuučaanňuł language and culture at λučḥa Daycare
- ➤ Ability to implement effective strategies to engage and support academic success for all learners in an inclusive environment
- Committed to professional development with a desire to learn and implement new methodologies and strategies to provide a creative, engaged, and inclusive classroom experience
- > Demonstrated ability to apply relevant computer technologies to teaching and learning
