CHARACTER STUDIES

MANDARIN as Additional Language course

- Recognize and read with accuracy frequently seen words and highly contextualized words and phrases.
- Generate and answer questions to demonstrate reading comprehension and use strategies to self-correct when needed.
- Maintain conversations on familiar topics with native Mandarin speakers at the level of a sentence or string of sentences.
- Understand the Chinese writing system and use certain sentence patterns to write meaningful sentences.
- Follow multiple written directions and begin to write a short essay using a structured model and teacher guidance.
- Respond to topics related to a 4rd grade curriculum in academic and social interactions, without interruption.
- Write 300 Chinese characters.

ARTS

The LBA Art classroom is a positive learning environment that helps to motivate students to be creative, solve problems, and think "outside the box".

MAIN GOAL:

LBA students are encouraged to make conscious choices. They are encouraged to ask questions like:

What materials are needed to accomplish this task?

How do these tools work? How can tools be used to make a particular effect?

What happens when I experiment with these tools and different mediums?

How does my work reflect how I feel and/or think?

Students build their self confidence and passion for learning when they are creatively encouraged and encouraged to create.

PRIMARY EMPHASIS:

<u>Create</u> - Learn to investigate, organize and complete works of art using the exploration of materials.

<u>Present</u> - Learn to share and listen to others explain the choices they make in art.

<u>Respond</u> - Learn to perceive, analyse, critique and interpret artistic work through discussion.

<u>Connect</u> - Learn about art in history and society...different times, places, and cultures.

In Grade 4, students apply the elements of design to communicate for a variety of purposes and on a variety of themes. The focus of visual arts in these grades is to help students extend their exploration of relationships and personal experience in their own world. Students use a broader range of subject matter and media (tools, materials, processes, and techniques) to produce works of art. The teacher's role at this stage is to provide a positive working environment, facilitate the growth of technical skills and observational skills, and help students recognize that mistakes can be turned into creative opportunities.

Students use their knowledge of the elements and principles of design to solve artistic problems and analyse works of art. They generate and develop visual ideas in response to a variety of motivations, using imagination, observation, and a study of artists' works, and incorporate into their art ideas gained from sources such as independent reading.

Students explore and describe how different media influence the communication and interpretation of ideas in their own and others' work. They look beyond the surface meaning of art works and observe not only what is present but what is missing, in order to analyze and evaluate an artist's intent. They also analyze and describe how art-making processes and procedures clarify meaning and intentions in their own and others' work and observe how artists tell stories and create mood in their work. Students use their growing analytical and evaluative skills to investigate the purpose(s) and significance of objects, images, and art works in past and present cultures and to examine the contexts in which they were or are made, viewed, and valued.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

• Two, thirty-minute periods weekly; begin teaching basic fundamentals for sports such as volleyball, basketball, soccer, and softball; encourage development of individual skills as well as team building skills, encourage a habit of daily activity for overall fitness

MUSIC

- Notate and identify whole notes/rests, half notes/rests, quarter notes/rests, and eighth notes/rests
