STATE WINNERS ANNOUNCED FOR NATIONAL CARER AWARDS

New South Wales: Life Without Barriers and Carers Australia have today announced the New South Wales state winners for the National Carer Awards 2015.

The winners were announced at a ceremony at NSW Parliament House hosted by The Hon John Ajaka, Minister for Ageing and Disability Services.

The national awards recognise and celebrate unpaid carers and foster and kinship carers for the extraordinary contribution they make to the community.

Georgie Bennett, Allan Skippen and Cooper Riley were named as state winners for New South Wales. The winners were named across three categories: Family Carer, Foster and Kinship Carer, and Young Carer aged 25 years and under, respectively.

There are over 2.7 million ¹ unpaid carers in Australia of which over 770,000 are primary carers. There are a further 9,000 people who are foster carers and thousands more who care for a child who is known or related to them but not their own, known as kinship carers.

Chief Executive of Life Without Barriers Claire Robbs said carers often take on an immense workload and the National Carer Awards has been developed to raise awareness and understanding in the community.

“The state winners of the National Carer Awards have been recognised for the extraordinary unpaid support they provide. These carers work quietly behind the scenes and often it’s a long term commitment on their behalf,” Ms Claire Robbs said.

“Anyone, any time, can become a carer. The chances are you personally *are* a carer, *need* a carer or *know* a carer. Carers are an integral part of Australia’s health system and are the foundation of our aged, disability, palliative and community care systems,” said Carers Australia CEO Ara Creswell.

State and territory winners will be in the running to receive a national carer award across the three categories (one winner per category): Family Carer, Foster and Kinship Carer, Young Carer aged 25 years and under. Carers eligible for these awards are unpaid but may be receiving carer-related government payment or a reimbursement.

The National Carer Awards is a partnership between Carers Australia and Life Without Barriers and runs in every state and territory.

The Awards are funded by the Department of Social Services.
