

A warm welcome to all of you who pick up your shares at the farm!

### **Pick Up Times**

You may come to pick up your shares as early as noon on Thursdays.

You can pick up as late as 9:00.

If you cannot be here on Thursday, you are welcome to come on Friday to pick up your share. If you can't be here until Saturday or Sunday, please send an e-mail or leave a voice mail.

It is OK to come any time on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. We may not be here, but your share will be in the cooler.

Please remember to cross your name off the check off list posted next to the cooler door.

### **Where will you find your share?**

Park at the top of the driveway and walk down the hill to the packing shed. The shares are in the walk-in cooler straight ahead. Turn on the cooler light, walk in, take a container, close the door tight and turn off the light. Use the table to unpack your share and leave the plastic container and lid on the table, stacked with the other containers.

**Dog:** You may be greeted by Nasta (rhymes with pasta). She is a husky with a brown and blue eye. She on an invisible fence so if you walk on the grass next to the barn, you are out of her territory and she will sit and watch you. This can be a nice safe place for children who want to see the big dog but not interact.

**Please leave your dogs at home** when you come to pick up your share. If your dog happens to be in the car, please park on the grass in front of the barn (not in the driveway) and don't let your dog out of the car. Thanks.

**Seconds/Extras** We often have extras and seconds on the table. Help yourself and don't be shy. This is a benefit of picking up at the farm.

**Eggs:** There may be eggs for sale. They are from a neighbor and are \$4 / dozen. There is a place for your money. Empty egg cartons accepted.

**Your farmers:** We are usually around, but sometimes out in a field or working in our office. We try to be near the packing shed on Thursdays.
