LEFT my residence, near the Great Falls of Potomac, in Fairfax county, just before last Whitsuntide, a yellow man by the name of

WILL, or BILL;

(I believe he calls himself *William Lee*.) about 25 years of age, 5 feet, 9 or 10 inches high; tolerably well made, thin visage, a scar near the external angle of one of his eyes, full sized white teeth; and generally carries his chew of tobacco between his teeth and under lip, wears a cue, sometimes in front on his foretop, and sometimes behind; had a sore the size of a dollar on one of his legs. He is now hired to Mr. Nelson Hutchinson at Fauquier court house. He has a wife, the property of J.H. Cassary, near Waterford;—His acquaintance in Loudoun is extensive.—He is also well acquainted in Fairfax, Prince William and Fauquier. He left Mr. Hutchinson's the Saturday before Easter—He probably has a pass or counterfeit papers of freedom.

Will has gone off with a black man of Thomas Swann, Esq. from his farm near Leesourg. They are no doubt making the best of their way to Pennsylvania or Ohio—a black and yellow man answering their description, I understand have been taken up in Boonsborough, above Fredericktown, and were discharged in consequence of the free papers they produced. They passed down the road to Montgomery court house, where they remained a day or two and were afterwards seen going up the River Road towards Conrad's Ferry, enquiring the way to Bedford, and some other place in Pennsylvania.—If taken in Loudoun, Prince William, Fauquier or Fairfax, I will give \$20—if taken in any other county of the state, \$30—if taken in Maryland, \$40—if taken in any other state or territory, and secured in jail so that I get him, \$50—if delivered to me the above reward and all reasonable charges will be paid.

Will is a smart, sensible and very plausible fellow. Mr. Swann's man is rather lower than mine, and stout made. His name is William, calls himself William Swann.
