

Welcome to worship!

What's the most embarrassing thing you've ever seen at a wedding reception? Does an inappropriate toast crack your Top 5? How about some wedding crashers? If that's the best you can do, I've got you beat. On January 1, 2009, I officiated the wedding of a member of my church. In New York City. Live, on MTV. As part of their "Bridal Bowl," a member of my congregation, her husband, and three other couples got married in front of a TV audience estimated to be close to 3,000,000. (Interestingly, MTV paid my way, put me up in a nice hotel and let me preach whatever I wanted to, so long as I stayed within their time limits. The Gospel was proclaimed and sent out nationwide courtesy of the channel that also brought you Beavis and Butthead.)

One of the couples stood out more than the rest. She was a drama queen. He was into his physique. She told him on the day of the reception: "whatever you do, don't wear the muscle-tux." Secretly, I hoped that he would, as I had never seen a "muscle-tux" and recognized that this might be my one and only opportunity to do so in this life. Mr. Universe did not disappoint. Well, he didn't disappoint me. He did, unfortunately, disappoint his bride, who glared disapprovingly at him during their now-awkward wedding ceremony. Men, when you are having one of "those" conversations with your wives, you have my permission to say the words: "at least I didn't wear the muscle tux."

What made the reception awkward was that the bride decided that, instead of joining her for-better-or-worse husband, she was going to spend the next several hours locked in the Green Room, sobbing uncontrollably. Embarrassing. But not nearly as embarrassing as the scene at a wedding banquet described in Luke 14. Not by a long shot.

I hope you enjoy your time in worship this morning as we take a look at what has to be the most awkward and embarrassing wedding reception as Jesus teaches Pharisees, his disciples and you about true humility.

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Proverbs 25:6-14

Do not put yourself forward in the king's presence

or stand in the place of the great,

for it is better to be told, "Come up here,"

than to be put lower in the presence of a noble.

What your eyes have seen

do not hastily bring into court,

for what will you do in the end,

when your neighbor puts you to shame?

Argue your case with your neighbor himself,

and do not reveal another's secret,

lest he who hears you bring shame upon you, and your ill repute have no end.

And Jesus responded to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath, or not?" But they remained silent. Then he took him and

healed him and sent him away. And he said to them, "Which of you, having a son or an ox that has fallen into a well on a Sabbath day, will not immediately pull him out?" And they could not reply to these things.

Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honor, saying to them, "When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honor, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, 'Give your place to this person,' and then you will begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' Then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
