Welcome to worship!

Have you ever had a bad boss? I mean a really bad boss. A boss so bad that it made every day feel like Monday. Worse than the boss in "Office Space". Even worse than the bosses in "Horrible Bosses". (If you haven't, I'm told Vicar and Julie can fill you in on what you've missed.)

There are plenty of characteristics that make bosses bad. From not respecting your personal life or your time, to having unrealistic demands, to not listening to what you have to say, to not knowing how to use the human and material resources at their disposal to get the job done, there are a number of ways a boss can move from the necessary-evil category to the terrible-boss category. Getting along with the boss at work goes a long way to making a job bearable, even enjoyable.

So what does this have to do with our text from John 10? This text, the well-known (I hope) "Good Shepherd" discourse, paints a powerful picture of Jesus, as one who not only cares for those who are his, but has the power to fend off those who would do harm to the ones under his care. It's hard for us to think in terms of shepherd and sheep. We can imagine what it must be like to be a shepherd or a sheep, but the analogy has a hard time connecting with people who have cell phones and SUV's, grocery stores and cable TV. Perhaps it would be helpful to see certain elements of the analogy of sheep and shepherd along the lines of boss and employee.

Have you ever had a good boss?

May I suggest that you do. In Christ, you have a boss who cares for his employees (sending you home early, while he works overtime), knows how to use the resources at his disposal to get the job done (the Body of Christ fulfilling the Great Commission), and listens to what his employees have to say (in prayer). His demands are simple: come to me, and I will give you rest. He is the Good Shepherd, and we are his people, the sheep of his pasture! Alleluia!

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-16

"For thus says the Lord God: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. There they shall lie down in good grazing land, and on rich pasture they shall feed on the mountains of Israel. I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I myself will make them lie down, declares the Lord God. I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, and the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them in justice.

The New Testament Reading: 1 Peter 2:21-25

For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps. He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin

and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd."

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood,... this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
