Welcome to worship!

How did you get your name? Was it a name that had been in your family for generations? Did one of your parents have a good friend growing up whose name they wanted to honor by giving it to you? I was named after a Presbyterian Pastor who helped my paternal grandmother out after my grandfather passed away at an early age, leaving her with eight children to raise during the height of the Great Depression. How did you get your name?

This evening, we continue our sermon series on the Names of the Christ. In Luke 1, we are told how the Christ received his name. In the Greek, it is Jesus; in Hebrew, Joshua. And in the dictionary: the Lord Saves.

Why would someone name their child "the Lord Saves"? It makes sense for people to name children Jesus (or Joshua) after the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension of the Christ—bearing witness to the truth of the good news. But before? The Lord's salvation before Christ usually amounted to relatively small-scale demonstrations of His power over various threats, foreshadowing the work of Jesus to save all people. "The Lord Saves" seems to be a strange name for a Jew to give her child while traveling to her husband's hometown to register in a census commanded by Caesar.

Instead of stating what the Lord had done when Jesus was born, the name Jesus pointed forward to what the Lord would do through his Christ. The name Jesus looked forward to the cross, the tomb, and the glorious return.

alone save.
