Welcome to worship!

"It's not you, it's me." When those words are spoken you can bet that someone's heart is broken and someone else is lying. This morning, we are going to take a look at the impossibly difficult text from the first half of Luke 16. Try as I might, I cannot tell you with certainty that I "get" what the purpose of this text is. Yes, I've read commentaries. Yes, I've prayed. Yes, I've tried to put it in context. I've even given the Thursday morning Bible Study group a shot at putting the pieces of the text together into one beautiful and congruous whole. But to no avail. I wish the text would say: "It's not you, it's me."

My hunch is that there is something in our text that would be understood by someone living in Jesus' day, but that is inaccessible to people living 5,000 miles and 2,000 years away from the origins of the text. With that all being said, there are a number of worthwhile teachings and personal applications we can take away from this text without fully understanding how the whole thing fits together. So we are going to have to tread lightly this morning. We are going to have to admit we don't know all there is to know about the passage, and that we probably won't ever be able to know.

Since I have your attention here, let me change gears and invite you to our Midweek Service this week. With all the tragic news coming out of Iraq and Syria about the persecution of the church, we are going to hold a prayer vigil for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are under severe duress for their faith. Please consider joining us and supporting them. 7:00pm Wednesday, right here at Zion.

The Old Testament Reading: 2 Samuel 22:26-34

"With the merciful you show yourself merciful;

with the blameless man you show yourself blameless;

with the purified you deal purely,

The New Testament Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:6-13

Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents, nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

The Gospel Reading: Luke 16:1-13

He also said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions. And he called him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager.' And the manager said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do, so that

when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses.' So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' He said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' He said, 'A hundred measure of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and write eighty.' The master commended the dishonest manager for his shrewdness. For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings.

"One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money."

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my body... this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
