## Welcome to worship!

Welcome to the New Year—the New Year of the Church that is. For the past number of weeks, we have been looking at Scriptures that speak of the end of the world, the resurrection of the dead, and the new creation. In other words, we were peeking ahead to the end of our story in Jesus. When we read about the final defeat of death, the wonder of no more pain in life, and the eternal joy in the presence of Jesus in his new creation, we cannot help but eagerly look forward to that Last Day.

And yet, here we are again, at the beginning of the story. In the past weeks, we have looked at the second coming of Jesus, and now we are back to looking at his first coming. To be honest, we feel disappointed and maybe even a bit frustrated because Jesus has not come back yet. The past few weeks allowed us to see the wonderful unveiling of the reign of heaven, and yet we still live in a time where God's reign feels hidden. It is hard to make the switch to readings for Advent, to the time before Jesus' incarnation. It is hard because we want the end to happen now.

Paul says in today's Epistle reading, "Besides this, you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand." Paul reminds Christians that though we still live in a dark, sin-filled, dying world, we also live as new creations of Jesus by faith. Christians live constantly at the end of the story while still in the middle of the story. We continue to celebrate the New Year and the first advent of Christ, all the while praying for His second advent. Come, Lord Jesus!

### The Service of the Word

### The Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 23:5-8

"Behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In his days Judah will be saved, and Israel will dwell securely. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

"Therefore, behold, the days are coming, declares the Lord, when they shall no longer say, 'As the Lord lives who brought up the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt,' but 'As the Lord lives who brought up and led the offspring of the house of Israel out of the north country and out of all the countries where he had driven them.' Then they shall dwell in their own land."

### The New Testament Reading: Romans 13:8-14

Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law. Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Leader: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 21st chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

### **The Gospel Reading:** Matthew 21:1-9

Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

"Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. Most of the

crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"
