

This week our focus is on the 4th Commandment—to honor father and mother. The first commandment governing our relationships with other people has a number of practical implications on our life. Usually used (correctly) by moms and dads to encourage their children to behave and do as they're told, the commandment also governs our relationships with other authorities—the police, government, the military, teachers, doctors, and many others. But the fun doesn't stop there; this commandment also addresses issues like how far we should go in obedience to authorities when what they tell us to do is wrong.

While easy to teach to our children (as we, the parents, benefit from its being practiced), the Fourth Commandment becomes more difficult with age. How do the adult children of parents "honor" an aging patriarch or matriarch? How do we honor our parents when they become unable to care and provide for themselves? And, maybe most unsettling, why is the Christian Church—across denominations—silent about this very relevant issue in an aging population?

There's a lot to cover this morning as we look at a Commandment that many of us heard a lot about as children, but has fallen silent when we became adults. The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Proverbs 23:13-25

Do not withhold discipline from a child; if you strike him with a rod, he will not die. If you strike him with the rod, you will save his soul from Sheol. My son, if your heart is wise, my heart too will be glad. My inmost being will exult when your lips speak what is right. Let not your heart envy sinners, but continue in the fear of the Lord all the day. Surely there is a future, and your hope will not be cut off. Hear, my son, and be wise, and direct your heart in the way. Be not among drunkards or among gluttonous eaters of meat, for the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, and slumber will clothe them with rags. Listen to your father who gave you life, and do not despise your mother when she is old. Buy truth, and do not sell it; buy wisdom, instruction, and understanding. The father of the righteous will greatly

rejoice; he who fathers a wise son will be glad in him. Let your father and mother be glad; let her who bore you rejoice.

The New Testament Reading: Ephesians 6:1-4

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise), "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land." Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Pastor: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 12th chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading: Mark 7:9-13

And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' But you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, "Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban" (that is, given to God)— then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, thus making void the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And many such things you do."

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, O Christ.

The Service of the Sacrament

Pastor:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Pastor:

As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim

the Lord's death until He comes.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Pastor: O Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, in giving us your

> body and blood to eat and to drink, You lead us to remember and confess Your holy cross and passion, Your blessed death, Your rest in the tomb, Your resurrection from the dead, Your

ascension into heaven, and Your coming for the final judgment.

So remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray:

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
