

Welcome to worship!

Cat got your tongue? Survey after survey confirms what every high school student giving a presentation in front of class knows to be true: our number one fear is speaking in public. This morning our readings focus on speaking and hearing.

As Christians, we have a message to speak to all who will listen. We have the good news of our Savior, Jesus. Paul tells us that "faith comes through hearing." But if faith comes through hearing, then someone has to do the hard work of speaking, of giving a reason for the hope that they have, speaking the name of Jesus.

I hope that you will be challenged this morning to speak the name of Jesus to a world full of people that either need to hear it for the first time, or who need a healthy dose of the gospel as they go about their day. Those who have never heard the name of Jesus need to know that they are loved by God, forgiven and redeemed, and promised the gift of everlasting life. Those who have heard it are walking the dangerous and difficult walk of faith and need to be reminded when the world and their sin gets them down that they serve the Lord of Life, who has shed his blood that they might live eternally.

I read an article on the internet last week about the Art of Small Talk. The author gave tips for how to start casual conversations and the benefit of having these conversations. By and large, we're pretty good at small talk. We can easily comment on the weather, the price of gasoline, or the upcoming Steelers' season. We can ask about kids, work, school and sports. We're even pretty good at giving our opinions about world events, politics and issues closer to home. But while important, these conversations are predictable. Instead, maybe it's time we took a chance with the things we talk about. Maybe it's time we said something of consequence and significance, something that could change the course of someone's day and make a difference in their lives. Maybe it's time we spoke the name of Jesus.

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 29:17-24

Is it not yet a very little while
until Lebanon shall be turned into a fruitful field,
and the fruitful field shall be regarded as a forest?
In that day the deaf shall hear
the words of a book,
and out of their gloom and darkness
the eyes of the blind shall see.
The meek shall obtain fresh joy in the Lord,
and the poor among mankind shall exult in the Holy One of Israel.
For the ruthless shall come to nothing
and the scoffer cease,
and all who watch to do evil shall be cut off,
who by a word make a man out to be an offender,
and lay a snare for him who reproves in the gate,
and with an empty plea turn aside him who is in the right.

Therefore thus says the Lord, who redeemed Abraham, concerning the house of Jacob:

"Jacob shall no more be ashamed,
no more shall his face grow pale.
For when he sees his children,
the work of my hands, in his midst,
they will sanctify my name;
they will sanctify the Holy One of Jacob
and will stand in awe of the God of Israel.
And those who go astray in spirit will come to understanding,
and those who murmur will accept instruction."

The New Testament Reading: Romans 10:5-17

For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. But the righteousness based on faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good

news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading: Mark 7:31-37

Then he returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. And Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
