

Welcome to worship!

This morning our focus is on the "Communion of Saints." Last week, we took a look at what we mean when we profess our faith in "one, holy, Christian and Apostolic Church." And, in doing so, we touched on part of our topic this morning: the Church Militant and the Church Triumphant; in other words, the church on earth and the church in heaven.

It seems like every-other week, someone is coming out with a book that swears they saw what heaven is like. And, it seems, that every vision of "heaven" that these books relate puts the emphasis oddly on lost loved ones and not on the one in the center of the throne. It's as if these books were written to alleviate our fears that we won't ever see our loved ones again after they die. It's as if these books were written to tell us what we want to hear. These books will continue to sell because the image given to us of heaven from the book of Revelation is a lot more difficult to understand.

This morning, we are going to spend our time together contemplating what life might be like for those in the "church triumphant," heaven. We will also take a look at how this compares to how Jesus describes what the lives of his disciples will be like in the "church militant," the church on earth. I want to take time this morning to answer several questions about heaven that I've been asked over the last ten-or-so years because the answers to them given in Scripture are better than the human fictions that are created to make people feel better.

Confession of Sins

As you prepare to confess your sins, think back over the last week. The hurtful words, the loveless deeds, and the unhealthy thought you have had and done; and leave them all at the foot of the cross.

Pastor: Brothers and sisters in Christ, this morning we celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church at Pentecost as we look at the connection between the church on earth and the church in heaven. We have been given the Holy Spirit to give us faith and lead us in obedience to everything Christ has commanded us in his Word. Therefore, let us confess that we have not let the Holy Spirit become the controlling influence in our lives; we have chosen to listen to our sinful flesh instead of following Christ and stand in need of forgiveness.

People: Lord Jesus Christ, you have been kind and good to me. You died on the cross for my sins and sent the Holy Spirit into my life to lead me in faith and obedience. But I have shut him out and have obeyed the devil, the world and my own sinful flesh. I want to start new today. I want a clean slate. Forgive my sins, deal with me in kindness and patience and lead me to follow you all the days of my life. I ask this in your name. Amen!

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 60: 1-11

Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you. And nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your rising. Lift up your eyes all around, and see; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from afar, and your daughters shall be carried on the hip. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and exult, because the abundance of the sea shall be turned to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall bring good news, the praises of the Lord. All the flocks of Kedar shall be gathered to you the rams of Nebaioth shall

minister to you; they shall come up with acceptance on my altar, and I will beautify my beautiful house. Who are these that fly like a cloud, and like doves to their windows? For the coastlands shall hope for me, the ships of Tarshish first, to bring your children from afar, their silver and gold with them, for the name of the Lord your God, and for the Holy One of Israel, because he has made you beautiful. Foreigners shall build up your walls, and their kings shall minister to you; for in my wrath I struck you, but in my favor I have had mercy on you. Your gates shall be open continually; day and night they shall not be shut, that people may bring to you the wealth of the nations, with their kings led in procession.

The New Testament Reading: Revelation 7:9-17

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?" I said to him, "Sir, you know." And he said to me, "These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

"Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat.

For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Pastor: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 25th chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading: Matthew 25:31-40

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. And he will place the sheep on his right, but the goats on the left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.' Then the righteous will answer him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? And when did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? And when did we see you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

The Service of the Sacrament

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took

bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in

remembrance of Me."

Pastor: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim

the Lord's death until He comes.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

People: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy

The Distribution

We welcome to the Lord's Table all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God, can examine themselves spiritually and believe they receive the true body and blood of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins and as a profession of their faith. If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
