

Welcome to worship!

"Be Prepared" I was told during my very limited experience with the Boy Scouts of America. But aside from carrying around a Swiss Army Knife and learning how to tie several knots, I'm not sure the motto sunk in. Fast forward twenty (or so) years and I'm working my way through the Pastoral Leadership Institute. They are giving us leadership and ministry structure models to learn at one of their conferences, when a presenter (whose name I unfortunately was not prepared enough to remember), said something I hope to never forget. He said: "never go into a meeting without knowing the outcome." In other words: Be Prepared.

In our Gospel Lesson this morning, Jesus tells a parable about preparedness. He uses images of wedding feasts and maidens, lamps, sleep, oil and a bridegroom to respond to a series of questions posed to him by his disciples after he made cryptic remarks about the obliteration of the temple in Jerusalem. "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?" Jesus does not give what we would consider a direct answer to his disciples. He answers with words reserved for the apocalypse before giving three parables. Our Gospel Lesson is the first of the three. Followed by the so-called Parables of the Talents and Sheep and Goats, the major teaching Jesus gives is to be prepared. The Son of Man could come before you expect (the master's return in the Parable of the Talents), or take longer than you had hoped (the bridegroom's entrance in the Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins). But when he comes, it is best to be ready so that you are not separated like chaff from wheat or like goats from sheep.

"Be prepared." It's good advice for anticipating unknown dangers in day-to-day life. It's even better advice when it has been revealed that the world will face an allencompassing judgment. "Be prepared."

This morning, we will look at what Jesus says it means to be prepared for his coming. If you were expecting a light-and-fluffy message in church, I have a feeling you will be disappointed. But if you came expecting to be challenged and encouraged, I think you'll find a lot to like in what Jesus has to say.

Our focus this morning is on Jesus' words to his disciples about the end times. His teaching is straightforward: be ready for his return, because he returns to judge the world. We have been warned of his coming to separate sheep from goats, to reward wise tenants and punish the lazy ones, and to welcome those who have kept their lamps trimmed in expectation of his coming to the proverbial wedding feast. Therefore, in view of his promised coming, let us confess our sins.

People:

Lord Jesus Christ, it is easy for me to confess with my mouth that you are coming back, but it is harder to practice this belief. I have sinned and, without your grace, deserve nothing but punishment when you return. Therefore, I ask that you would have mercy on me, forgive me all of my sins, and lead me to greater faith and obedience through the influence of your Holy Spirit in my life. Amen.

The Service of the Word

The Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 65:17-25

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress. No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the young man shall die a hundred years old, and the sinner a hundred years old shall be accursed.

They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat; for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be the offspring of the blessed of the Lord, and their

descendants with them. Before they call I will answer; while they are yet speaking I will hear. The wolf and the lamb shall graze together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, and dust shall be the serpent's food. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain," says the Lord.

The New Testament Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers, you have no need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. While people are saying, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you are not in darkness, brothers, for that day to surprise you like a thief. For you are all children of light, children of the day. We are not of the night or of the darkness. So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, are drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.

Pastor: In honor of our Lord Jesus Christ, we rise for the reading of the

Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 25th chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading: Matthew 25:1-13

"Then the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them, but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. As the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and slept. But at midnight there was a cry, 'Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' Then all those virgins rose and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said to the

wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was shut. Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

The Distribution

If you hold a profession of faith that differs from that of our congregation, please speak to the Pastor before the start of the service before communing.

- We believe the body and blood of Christ are truly present in the bread and wine.
- We believe Christ offers the forgiveness of sins in the Lord's Supper, but that the Lord's Supper is not necessary for salvation.
- We believe the Lord's Supper remembers the death of Christ and proclaims his death until he returns.
- We believe the Lord's Supper is a statement of unity in the body of Christ; we do not believe it creates that unity.

During the distribution, you are encouraged to sing the Distribution Hymns, pray, or meditate on the words "this is my blood, given for you."

The cups at the center of the Individual Communion tray contain diluted wine for those with alcohol sensitivities.
