Confession of Sins

- Pastor: This evening, our focus is on the Gospel Lesson from last Sunday: the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant. Like the servant in the parable, we have been forgiven much; more than we could ever hope to repay or earn. And yet we have been stubborn in demonstrating this lavish grace and forgiveness in the lives of the people we know, as well as the stranger on the street. Therefore, let us confess our sins, trusting in the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.
- People: Lord Jesus Christ, you taught your disciples to practice forgiveness because they had been forgiven much. We confess that we have been quick to find fault in others, but slow to forgive. Have mercy on us, be patient with us, and allow the Holy Spirit to be the controlling influence in our lives. We ask this in your name and according to your will that all would be saved. Amen.

Absolution Spoken by the Pastor

People: Amen.

The Reading: Matthew 18:21-35

Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and | forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "| do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times.

"Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. When he began to settle, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. And since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.' And out of pity for him, the master of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. But when that same servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, 'Pay what you owe.' So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and | will pay you.' He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the debt. When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. Then his master summoned him and said to him, You wicked servant! | forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."
