Dear Sir.

At the monthly meeting of the Executive Com. of the Am. Abolition Society, yesterday I laid before them your letters in respect to a full supply of all the Members of Congress with your Constitutional Argument,\* with the blank petitions and circulars, and recommended the adoption of measures for completing it to which the Committee has acceded, in conformity, (as we understand it) with the suggestions of your letters: - that is to say: - If W. Marsh will immediately get out an edition of your [?]Sd[?] work in paper covers, and furnish us with the balance needed, (ninety six copies) and if you will pay W. Marsh for the same with the balance (Eight Dollars) from us, in your hands, and from the funds furnished by Gerrit Smith to you; then our Committee will purchase of W. Marsh, One Hundred additional copies in paper covers, on the same terms as before, for the use of our Depository. We shall also keep them advertised in our monthly paper (perhaps in other ways) shall sell as many as we can, and give away as we may be able, to particular persons of intelligence or influence - and when the supply is exhausted, shall order more as they may be needed.
