

UPDATE NO.186: 2019/20 - CLUB OF THE YEAR!

The 2019/20 Season may have ended a fraction prematurely but, for Parnell, it was a resounding success. Over it's long history, 163 years, the Club has won many championships and produced some of New Zealand's finest cricketers but few seasons have produced the results and accolades gained in 2019/20.

COVID 19 has meant the postponement of the Annual Awards Dinner but Auckland Cricket has just announced the trophy winners and a superb collection of silverware comes to Parnell and our Players:



"Club of the Year" - the Simmonds & Osborne Trophy awarded to Parnell Cricket Club

Parnell last won this Award 27 years ago. The Trophy dates from 1905/06 when it was awarded jointly to City, Grafton, North Shore and Parnell Cricket Clubs. Parnell was the sole awardee in 1909/10 and North Shore won in 1910/11 but, then, till 1926/27 there were No Awards made. Reinstated the next season, From then it was awarded each year to WW 2 with Parnell winning in 1933/34. No awards during the War but from 1946/47 it has been presented annually again and Parnell won it the next season, 1947/48.

Next, and represented by Eastern Districts (Parnell, Orakei, Ellerslie and Panmure CCs), we won in 1959/60. The District Scheme ended in 1966 but Parnell did not win the Trophy again until 1992/93. That season Mike Simpson, our present Patron, was both President and Chairman. It has taken another 27 years to win again. A long time and reflects well on the performances right through the grades, Boys, Girls, Men and Women of all ages – 5 year olds to 70 year olds who took the field for the Club in 2019-20.



Other ACA Awards



Mark Chapman – celebrating his 100 vs India A Photo per Getty Images Aces' Batsman of the Year AND Highest Score on Eden Park - Ridings Cup: 146 Auckland vs N.D. ACA's Citation: Chapman played several memorable knocks in the 2019/20 summer. The lefthander was particularly impressive through the second half of the season, hitting an unbeaten 84 to take the ACES to victory in the Ford Trophy final and twin Plunket Shield hundreds (143 and 146) in a thrilling one-wicket win over Northern Districts. Adding to these excellent performances for the ACES, the 25-year old also notched back-to-back hundreds for New Zealand A against the touring India A side.



lan West Coach of the Year – the Merv Wallace Bat

ACA's Citation: Ian West built on last summer's Jeff Crowe Cup success by leading Parnell to two finals and lifting the Hedley Howarth Trophy. West kept the Peaches focussed after tight defeats in the T20 and 50 Over finals going on to claim Parnell's first two-day title since 2014/15. With Parnell going as close as any to the treble, it's no surprise that West claims Club Coach of the Year for 2019/20.





Brad Rodden Most Positive Premier Grade Player - The Dick Shortt Memorial Trophy This is an award made by the Auckland Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association. Dick Shortt was a noted and very much respected umpire through the 1950/60s and stood in 9 Tests. In 2018/19 the Umpires awarded Brad "Captain of the Year"

New Book | Mark Burgess: Talent to Burn by Bill Francis

Two weeks ago, Auckland Cricket was set to host the book launch of Bill Francis' new work honouring former double international and Auckland stalwart, Mark Burgess. Unfortunately, Covid-19 restrictions forced the cancellation of the event.

The book penned by the eminent New Zealand writer Bill Francis, with Forewords by Graham Vivian and Vic Pollard, pays tribute to a fine sportsman who represented his country in cricket and football, captaining New Zealand for a period. It looks at the life of a brilliant and talented sportsman who developed his chosen games to reach the top.

Burgess featured in 50 tests for New Zealand and amassed 68 First Class appearances for Auckland, for whom he scored 4228 runs with 10 centuries.

Mark was able to combine a successful business career with playing sport for a period before retiring to move into a different phase of his life. He more than re-payed his time away from his employer, Brittain Wynyard, in the early days to remain with them until retirement.

If you would like to learn more about this wonderful sportsman and recall those days of New Zealand cricket when wins were important for the development of the game of the amateur game then this book will be of interest to you.

FROM YOUR EDITOR – A PERSONAL COMMENDATION

A personal commendation – Mark Burgess grew up at Parnell, one of a very special group of schoolboys nurtured, encouraged and challenged by the Club. Mark was a Parnell member from very young – the photo below of the Club's Opening Day, October 1954 shows Mark as a 10 year old. He, and his mate, Terry Jarvis, represented Eastern Districts in the annual ACA Primary School Tournament and in his secondary school days played for Auckland Grammar on Saturday mornings and, in the afternoons for Parnell until, quite early because of his talent, he was selected for Grammar's 1st XI. Play for Parnell was restricted to holidays but gave him the opportunity to play with adults in the Eastern Districts grade. Parnell fielded 3 teams in that grade, "Reds", "Whites" and "Blues", which soaked up anybody wanting a game – from retired Premier players to 13 year olds. Great learning experience for youngsters playing with the likes of Ray Emery, Jack Forsman, Sam Sukias and Peter Badley. Reputations meant nothing – I remember Tom Burtt, up from Canterbury, great left arm spinner with the NZ '49ers, being carted for 6 four times in one over – at Hobson Park, the ball sailing over the hedge onto Market Road.

For Mark, after Grammar for a season or two, the runs didn't come quite so easily. At Grammar Mark had been exceptionally successful with his off spinners but there was competition. Eastern already had Geoff Rabone and Ross Morgan bowling offies. Colin Stringer also joined – from England, a very competent left arm orthodox spinner. Johnny Carson was another left arm spinner coming into contention. Auckland had John Sparling as incumbent offie and, lefties, Hedley Howarth and John McIntyre were locked in mortal combat. Opportunities for Mark's off spin were severely restricted.

Not yet required for the Auckland Plunket Shield team, he had already done well with the bat in the Brabin Cup (U19s) and Rothmans (U23) Tournament, Mark was selected to make his 1st Class debut, for the NZ Under 23 XI vs Auckland in March 1964. A couple of years later, the frustrated offie, despite the dictates of the District Scheme with its residential requirements, decide to move from Parnell/Eastern to play for Grafton. The District Scheme was failing already and Mark's departure hastened its end. Some disappointment but Mark's move was pragmatic and he remained a great friend of all his former colleagues and team mates at Parnell. Mark is an Hon. Vice President of Parnell CC.

At Grafton, Mark's batting bloomed whilst his bowling, ironically, didn't – but that is for Bill Francis to tell. Bill is a marvelous author – wonderful that he has chosen to write this biography of Mark. Bill's biography of Stu Dempster is great reading and I am sure this book on Mark will be , too!



Your Committee has pleasure in submitting for your consideration, the Annual Report, Accounts and Balance Sheet for the 1959–1960 season.

For the first time for a number of years the Club was not successful in winning a championship in either the A.C.A. or E.D.C.A. Competitions. In spite of this some very good team performances were recorded and it is very pleasing to note the outstanding improvement made by the Eastern Districts Cricket Club Second Grade team, which finished runners-up in their Competition. This is the best performance of this team since the inception of district cricket. Parnell again supplied the majority of players for the District Club's two top teams as well as the captain and vicecaptains. The Senior team performed well and this coupled with the high placing of the second grade team was sufficient to give the District, the Club Championship.

The Parnell teams in the Auckland Cricket Association competition performed well although the teams in the Eastern Districts competition were not as successful as expected. Following the recommendation of last year's Committee, the Club fielded a team of colts with one or two adults as the senior members. This proved quite a successful venture and more should be heard of the players who made up this team. A feature of last season's games were the extraordinary number of one day games played after the holiday break. This meant an early start in the morning and it was not always possible to field our strongest teams.

Some very good individual performances in batting and bowling were recorded. It is very noticeable that the brunt of the bowling attack for both District teams fell on the older members and this was also true to a certain extent in the Parnell teams in the Club grades.

During the winter months, the Auckland Cricket Association made available indoor practice facilities at the Showgrounds and they are to be congratulated on their effort. All our members who took part were very pleased with the organisation that made it possible to get that extra bit of practice before the season got under way.

EDITOR'S COMENT:

I left college at the end of 1959 and whilst my average, playing for the First Club XI (ie our Thirds today) was a meager 17, it was better than those of the slightly younger Terry Jarvis, Ross Edwards and Johnny Carson who went on to infinitely better things in cricket. Terry went on to hit 184 for NZ vs West Indies and Ross 170 for Australia vs England at Trent Bridge in 1972. Of these 3 teams:

Test Players Past or Future: Merv Wallace, Geoff Rabone, Johnny Hayes, Ray Emery, Terry Jarvis,

Ross Edwards and Mark Burgess. Merv, Geoff and Mark all captained New Zealand in Tests. Two further members of the Senior team, Bill Playle and Ross Morgan, present and future Test players, aren't listed in the averages as at the time they were Orakei CC members but were important Eastern Senior team members. In addition, Frank Hemmingson, Brian Sorenson, Eric Giles, Peter McGregor and Johnny Carson all played First Class cricket.

CRAIG SPEAKMAN, OUR HISTORIAN, REPORTS:

1992 saw the start of the Deck project whereby the Club built the Deck at the Orakei Pavilion. This was a major undertaking and was driven by David Anderson with initial help from Mark Hepburn. David worked tirelessly on this project with help from Craig Speakman, John Duncan, Dean Larsen, David Sutcliffe, Kerry Topp, Chris Kilgour, Brian Hall and David's father Robert.

This was an incredible season for the Club. In all grades 18 centuries were scored, four hat tricks were achieved and there were 8 performances of 6 wickets in an innings. Quite remarkable and no wonder the Club won the overall Auckland Club Championship this season for the first time since 1959/60 (as Eastern Districts).

The Club did not import a professional in the 1992/93 season and instead we appointed Greg M Wallace (Son of Merv) as coach and Graham Laird as manager with a young Chris Kilgour as captain. The highlights of the season were the maiden centuries by Clark Whiteman, Robbie Stevens, and Kyle Walton. Chris Kilgour led by example with 841 runs, Kerry Topp 598, Rod Aitken 543, Clark Whiteman 524, Andrew Walton 377, Robbie Stevens 371 and Matthew Stevens 265. The leading wicket takers were Bruce Hunt 39, Kerry Topp 31, Chris Kilgour 29 and Yorkshireman Ben Wood with 24. Ben Wood was an unusual character, a lively medium pace bowler who had played first class cricket for Oxford University and represented Combined Universities v Pakistan. Ben was popular coaching the junior section. The Teams "Aunt Sally" Mike Steele took 27 catches and 4 stumpings.

The 30 January 1993 "was a historic day with Parnell's first women's side playing Cornwall." The team captained by Robyn Potter "started the journey into the unknown". The Team played 8 games, winning 3. The Team's outstanding players were Robyn's daughter future Auckland Heart Rachel Potter who scored 114 runs and took 16 wickets including a hat trick and Melissa Thompson who scored 127 runs and took 13 wickets.

It is also interesting reviewing the seasons report to note the mediation training being used to good effect by future Governor General Arnand Satyanand (father of Anya) while settling a dispute with Indian Sports!

The 1992/93 season saw the Under 16 Premier, Under 14 Premier and under 14 ½ Regional teams winning their grades.

The Under 16 Premiers managed by John Richards won the Southern Zone competition playing 8 matches, winning 5 and drawing 3. Once again the benefit of using a small number of players (14) helped the team. The leading run getters were Andrew Graydon 287, Ben Nausbaum 233, Tim Newland 174, Tim McIntosh 167 and Mark Cumming 150. The leading wicket takers were Ian Richards 11 and Andrew McMurtrie 10.

The Under 14 Premiers managed by Alan Frankenburg won its Southern division. The highlights were:

- Tim Frankenburg 451 runs at 90 including two centuries.
- Andrew Barber 23 wickets at 7.
- Nick Smeaton's all round performances 184 runs (average 184) and 12 wickets.
- Brent Lindenberg and William Tietjiens batting aggregates of 179 and 104 respectively.

The under 14 ½ Regional South team managed by Derek Thomas and Arnold Pickmere won the south section. Tony Chamberlain averaged 212 (only once out in 5 innings) and David Pirie with a hat trick were the standout performances. Also of note were Cameron Clark (played Otago A last season) 266 runs, Chris Thomas 246, Robert Samuels 187 a future Club Captain Ed Pickmere with 180 runs. The leading wicket takers were Tom Chamberlain 18, Chris Thomas 13, and Robert Samuels 11.

The Presidents had a dramatic improvement in the fortunes with the side coming 2nd equal in the championship round. As the "Raunchy Rev" reminded the team regularly "It might take you guys longer now and be more energy sapping but at least the results achieved will be worthwhile."

In all senior grades the batting aggregates made impressive reading with four batsmen below Premier exceeding 500 runs - Andrew Barns-Graham 713, Peter Dufaur 519, Jon McIntosh 504 and Gordon Wilson 503. Likewise four bowlers exceeded 30 wickets being Evan Impson 42, Steven Bendall 39, Maurice Western 35 and Roger Harvey 33.

The obituary of Life Members COLIN McMILLIN and ROY SCHNAUER were recorded. "Colin was another Life Member lost to the Club in recent months and again perhaps one not known to many current members. When our schoolboy division was founded in 1949 as the Remuera Parnell Sports Club he was one of the original committee and a hardworking administrator of other sports as well as cricket. His service with that Club continued in an unbroken stint for 12 years during which time the Club gained some of its finest players from Schoolboy ranks. He was also a Committee Member and enthusiastic supporter of the Eastern District Cricket Association. In those earlier years Colin managed both Club and District teams on many occasions. Together with Roy Schnauer, his memory is perpetuated in the Centennial History of the Club by the photograph of the successful Secondary School team of which he was manager. Colin will also always be remembered as father of Graham and grandfather of Matthew, two well known Club players in recent years."



Roy Schnauer is remembered by the writer as "Mr" Schnauer. Roy was the face of the Remuera-Parnell Junior Club when I was a junior player. His obituary read as follows: "Roy died suddenly when in his early fifties may not have been known to many current members as he had been living in Taupo for a number of years. His Life Membership of our Club came through his outstanding services to our Schoolboy Division. When the Division was founded in 1949 as a separate unit there were a number of capable administrators and ex cricketers, who were parents of the young members and joined together to administer and organise the teams. However there came a time in the 1960's when such people were simply not available and it was at this time that Roy showed his outstanding capabilities as an organiser. For some five years, almost single handedly he carried the administration burden of a Club with over 20 teams of boys playing each Saturday morning.

Although not enjoying the best of health throughout his life, Roy played cricket in his early days and probably his proudest playing achievement was as a member of the Parnell Secondary School Team which won the Eastern Competition and was runner up in the ACA Championship in 1957/58. He continued to play for the Club after leaving school but gradually the organising task at Ayr Street took up all his time. In a way this was fortunate for without Roy's services over the five years mentioned earlier what is now a strong and flourishing unit could well have foundered. Roy also served the Eastern Schoolboy Association as a Selector and frequently managed the representative teams at the Christmas tournament.

He also served as a delegate to the ACA Junior Board for a number of years."

Another obituary mentioned was of Honorary Vice President Roy Morgan the father of Ross.

Honours included

- The Club won the Auckland overall Club Championship for the first time since 1959/60.
- Tim McIntosh, Nick Smeaton and Willie Tietjens (reserve) were selected in the Auckland U14 Boys team.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Colin McMillin, along with Alan Brown, was Manager/Coach of the 1957/58 Schoolboy team that won the EDCA Championship and was 2nd in the ACA Junior Champs. I was a member of the side with Roy Schnauer. Later, it was thanks almost entirely to Roy that the Junior Section was saved – in 1959 16 teams were fielded, in 1970 only 5. All Colin and Alan's great work in the early days was coming undone, Roy saved the day. Others, Craig Speakman's father for one, then stepped in, rallied support and look what we have today! Junior Section trophies commemorate the great work that Colin and Roy did for the Club, particularly for the Juniors! No team photos are held for 1992/93 but Colin and Roy both appear in this photo below:



Parnell Secondary School XI 1957/58 - Colin McMillin – centre , middle row. Roy Schnauer, front row far right Important to note that this team of non 1st XI, but very keen, cricketers first came together late 1955 and, with few changes, continued together till 1958/59. Most of us transitioned to adult/senior ranks and, also, administration. Apart from Roy and myself:

- Graham Cowan went on to be President and Life Member of the NZ Umpires & Scorers Assn
- John Weir became Chairman of Sport Waikato
- David Moir a longstanding umpire & Secretary of Otago Umpires and Scorers Assn
- Alan Graham is a Life Member of the Karori CC having been a long time scorer at that club.
- John Kelso, organised much Businesshouse Cricket being responsible for the NZ Herald team

There is a very interesting, and promising, parallel today with the group of schoolboys who progressed to Seniors together and building up our Thirds – Ryan Bergman in the early days then Elliot Jaffe, Elliot Humphries, Luke O'Toole, Pete Hickman, Ashwin Haran and others.

Zac opened the bowling in both matches against the adults and picked up 4 wickets in total & batted at 8 hitting a creditable 25 in one match. They played also the Hilton School U16 side which they won comfortably. Then, in the final match they played the school first XI losing again and well beaten by the older and bigger boys. Zac was the main strike bowler in all matches but he found it tough turning out each day with that responsibility. Glammy normally send older boys on this tour, mostly 16 to 19s but Zac was one of 7 U15s with then only 5 U19s and, in match one, they lost to injury one of the best spinners, Ben Kellaway, and so they were up against it!

The tour was great success for the development of the Boys as it was a tough tour but also they did a lot including staying 2 days at Umhlanga Rocks, a lovely beach north of Durban, a day at Kingsmead to see England v South Africa (great cricket), a day at a Zulu cultural centre and Reptile Park and, a day at a fantastic game reserve. The school they stayed at, Hilton College, was fantastic"

The Core and the Cricketer.

It is a great pleasure and privilege working as a Chiropractor with people of all ages. One particular passion of mine is sport and I really enjoy working with people who are also passionate about their sport. It is such a great way to express our bodies potential, not to mention the minds. This summer we once again are the proud sponsors for the Men's Parnell Premier Cricket team and for the first time the Women's Premier Team.
