God's loving kindness that we see in Jesus is also present in the lives of Naomi and Ruth, despite the tragedy that marked their lives. We will explore how we can know the presence and love of God, even in times of crisis and despair.



In Paul's masterful letter to the church in Ephesus he helps us grasp a majestic vision of God's sovereignty, grace and redemption plan. He then envisions us to be people who take up our our responsibility to live out that vision for the sake of others as we love, serve and pray with faith and compassion.
