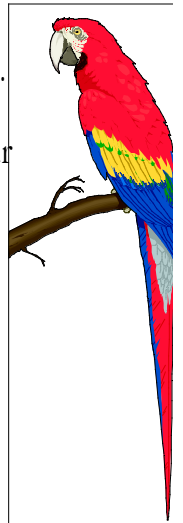
## Congratulations ...

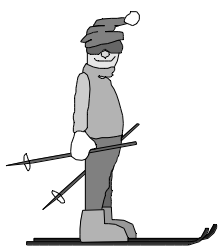

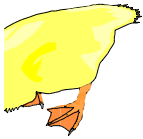

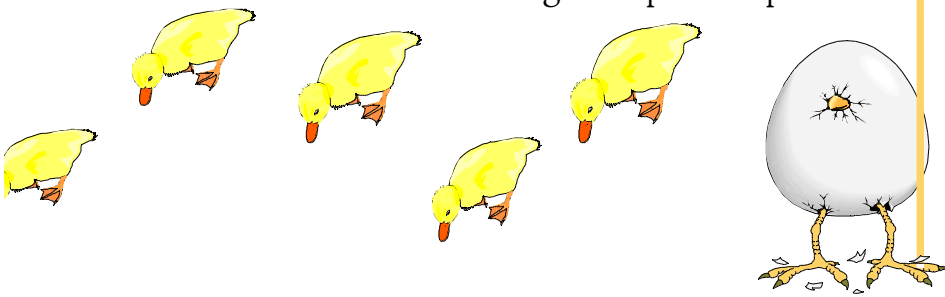
**Kiwanis Duck Race for Tiny Hearts at CHEO

Well, we finally got the newsletter going out in three different forms of medium! There are 63 members who receive their newsletter by fax, 125 by email, and 55 by mail.

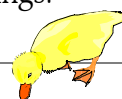

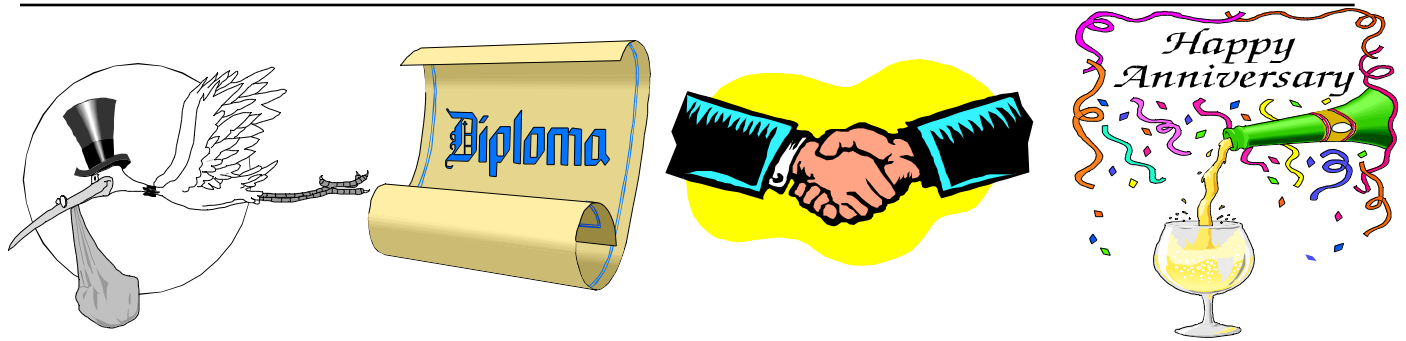

Your donation of \$15.00 or more, to Legacy for Life, supports the Kiwanis Club of Ottawa and its ongoing work. You will receive a charitable donation receipt for your donation. Sounds like a win-win situation all around!

### A Few Reminders about Legacy For Life

1. **What kinds of donations are accepted?** Legacy for Life is encouraging members to consider MAJOR DONATIONS such as : life insurance contracts, testamentary bequests, publicly trades shares, and/or monetary bequests.

2. **Can donors direct their gifts?** Donors may direct Major Donations within Legacy For Life for the benefit of the Medical Foundation, select Club committees such as Sponsored Youth, Young Children - Priority One, etc. Such donations ensure we can carry on our community and charitable work to those in need.

3. **What happens to the monetary donations received by Legacy For Life?** Money received from Major Donations or Card Donations are managed and invested by an investment counsellor, presently Bill Siekierski of RBC Dominion Securities. Under tax legislation, the income earned from such capital will be distributed at year's end by the Board of Directors to specific projects or allocated as part of the budgetary process. Previous years donations received throught the Legacy For Life Donor Card Program will be disbursed annually by decision of the Kiwanis Board of Directors.
