
Following is an excerpt from a letter received at the Kiwanis office:

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1999 Duck Race - May 15 - A New Challenge

As Chairs of the Duck Race, it has been not only our duty to execute a successful duck race but also to evaluate the importance of this event to Kiwanis.

The Duck Race, without question, is our flagship event and exemplifies the good work Kiwanis does in the community. Our association with the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) supports our mandate "Young Children - Priority One" and considerable proceeds of over \$3 Million have been donated to the CHEO foundation since the race began.

We also benefit from CHEO partnership with events such as the Dream of a Lifetime and the creation of our Kiwanis Endowment Fund (worth approximately \$850,000).

Each year we earn a \$30,000 administration fee for our work in the Duck Race, however, we have been given ticket sale performance milestones which could net our club up to \$100,000 (sales of 85,000 tickets +) if we put a little more effort into it.

There is no question that our club can perform great feats if we rise to the challenge. For this reason we have decided to change the way we conduct the Duck Race business so that we CAN attain this goal!

What's New for 1999?

- We are eliminating consignment ticket sales for the 1999 race.
- We will no longer rely on the uncertainty of tickets being returned unsold days before the race.
- We have designed a ticket dealer package that allows new and old duck dealers to pick different levels of participation giving them return on investment. Our only consignment tickets will be the Kiwanis share (20,000 tickets).

We will soon present Corporate Duck Dealer Kits to members of Kiwanis so you can present them to prospective companies which may want to become involved (selling period between February - mid March).

The levels of participation will be - but not limited to - Gold Feather Packages 5,000 tickets, Silver Tail Packages 2,000 tickets, and Bronze Bill Packages 1,000 tickets.

To date, 95% of our previous duck dealers (20) have committed to sell a set number of tickets. If we can find a few more companies to help sell the remaining tickets we will sell it out and hopefully reduce the number of consignment tickets Kiwanis needs to sell.

The Challenge - which company should you approach?

One of the strengths of Kiwanis is the business partnerships and connections we have in the city.

If you know of a dynamic company/CEO/individual that wants to contribute to a great cause and increase business, we now have the materials to help you approach them. The duck dealer kit will explain everything about the race and levels of participation and benefits.

Any size company can participate. Financial commitment is not required up front, just the company's commitment to be responsible for the number of tickets associated with the package they choose to support.

Companies can sell the tickets (100% cost recovery), use them in marketing promotions or give them away to employees or customers. Some examples of creative ways for companies to use the duck tickets

- combine tickets with promotions
- use as coupons
- employee challenges.

All you have to do is ask

The Duck Race Committee will provide incentive prizes for anyone bringing forward prospective companies.
