LAGUNA CHIC!

When jet-setting interior designer Brooke Ziccardi stays local, she hits Laguna Beach. We got her to spill on her fave spots for instant décor

Brooke Ziccardi's passport is the ultimate testament to her scouring and scavenging prowess. After all, this interior designer traverses the globe for major finds, going from Paris flea markets for rare antiques to Mumbai for

vintage saris. But when this Newport Beach native is stateside, she skips L.A. (yawn) in favor of Laguna, where the design Richter is off the charts with a bevy of new stores.

"I'm inspired daily by cultural design and color sensibilities from around the globe, but I've found that Laguna Beach offers so many exotic objects that are ideal for my varying projects," says Ziccardi, whose eponymous firm is getting ready to launch a line of Newport Beach-meets-India luxury furniture.

AREO

When Ziccardi is in search of casual home accessories like books, mirrors or vases, she heads to Areo, where she gives in to feverish impulse buying of the items she loves: local jewelry lines, stellar stationery and the (secret) stock of seashells. "They're hand-selected, with specimens of

ARIS

Coco Chanel once said, "Luxury begins where necessity ends." And, upon arrival at Aris, it's clear why owner Trey Russell has this quote emblazoned on his storefront's window. A recent addition to North Laguna's growing strip of home décor stores, Russell fled Artisance to be the captain of his own chicer-than-thou ship at Aris, where the "less is more" philosophy reigns supreme. And where else in O.C. can you find Jonathan Adler, Missoni Home and R & Y Augousti stingray furniture all under one roof? Ziccardi says she's all about Anne Ricketts' bronze statue. MADISON SQUARE

The alfresco café at Madison Square is a must, but one must not overloom the outdoor furnishings—think weathered busts and birdcages. TROVE

"Trove is vintage décor at its finest," says Ziccardi, "all waiting patient to be discovered and placed in their proper homes." TUVALU

Boasting the vaulted ceilings of a Polynesian resort lobby, Tuvalubrimming with island-themed décor and tropical indulgences for the hon and bath—but don't fret, there's no aloha overdose here. Tuvalu (meanin "trade winds warming the island") stocks acacia hardwood from Hawa cute wooden beach signs and Palecek light fixtures—décor that has a casuelegance, Ziccardi says. Ziccardi visits Artisance to stock up on Laguna glass artist Caleb Siemon's ornate pieces, which

THE BLACK IRIS

"This has got to be one of the most sophisticated fresh flower shops in Laguna," Ziccardi says of the Black Iris. "I've used this florist boutique when staging my photo shoots in the area.
