

DRAFT Definitions of Collective Impact Strategies
(based on 12/15 WG Meeting)

Shared accountability

- Collective responsibility for meeting the measures in the Outcomes Framework
- Creating systems outcomes for enacting these strategies
- Highlight how organizations are already aligning/collaborating – where shared accountability is already happening to further illustrate this definition
- Defining all the “systems” that are involved

Coordinated service delivery to reduce gaps and redundancies

- One-stop shop for parents /caregivers on the topic of summer, 0-5 care, free activities, libraries, parks, jobs for youth, afterschool, etc.
- Through the coordinated service delivery and data sharing, kids/youth/families should work with 1 lead case worker / advisor to access different services based on the needs. Avoid duplication of services, confusion and increase retention and provide wrap-around care. D
- Designated liaisons in agencies who “own” the responsibility for communicating across agencies

Targeted resources and coordinated budgets

- Blending resources and integrating planning and delivery
- Putting our most underserved youth and families at the center of our resources from a planning perspective; including them more authentically in resource allocation decisions;
- Specific RFP language/expectations to ensure collaboration across systems/entities
- Transparency in budgeting

Data Sharing to Improve Practice

- Common Protocols /legal frameworks
- Timely analysis and dissemination of data on a consistent ongoing basis
- Open access to aggregate data
- Ability to react to the gaps in services and needs through data sharing

Staff-training and capacity building

- We need workforce and delivery system that is capable
- Culture of collaboration – needs to be incentivized
- Technical assistance – having a model of organizational change that we all share
- One curriculum shared across organizations
