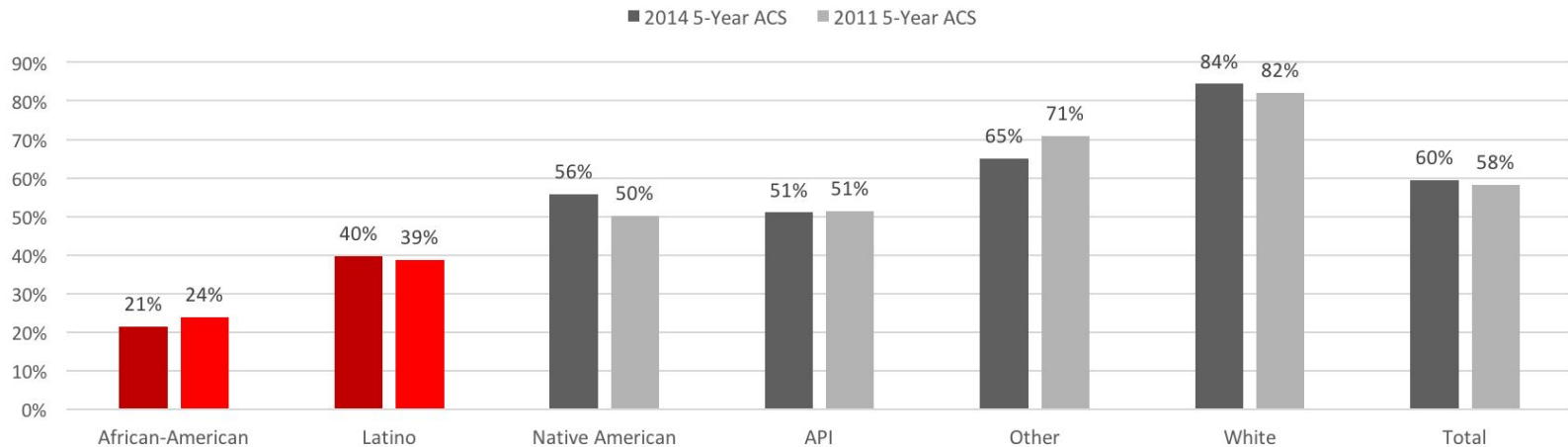
Self Sufficiency (B1) Equity Benchmarks

Goal B Families and transitional age youth, especially those most in need, attain economic security and housing stability for themselves and their children.

Measure 1 Self sufficiency

Benchmark: The percent of African American and Latino families above the self sufficiency standard is significantly lower than all other race/ethnicity groups.

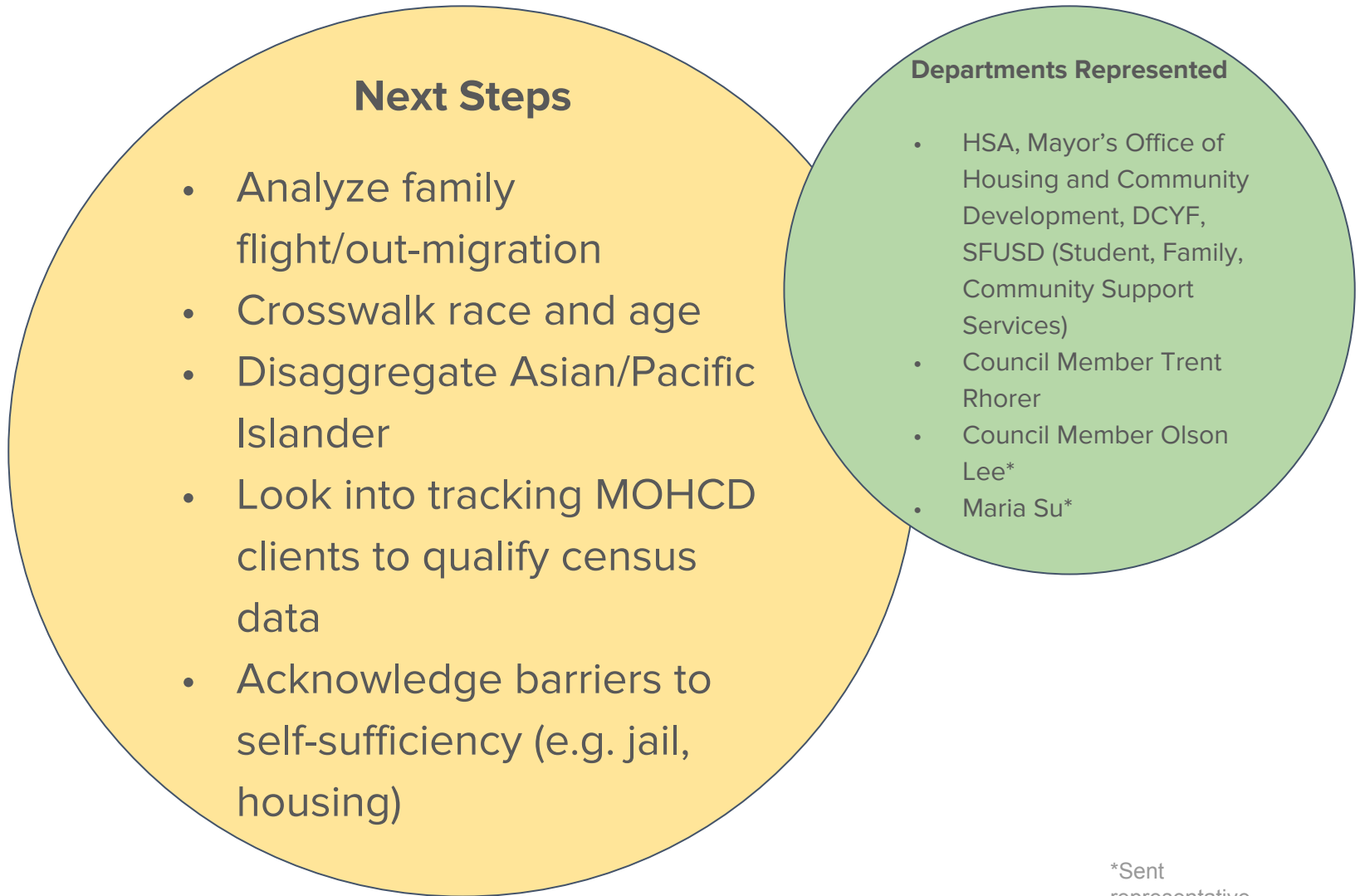

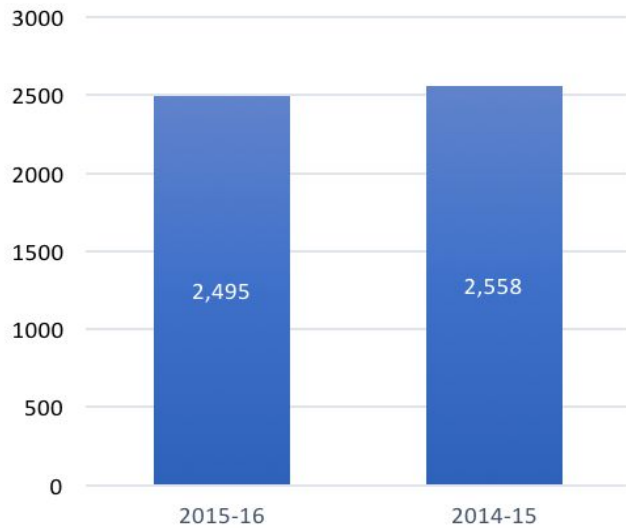

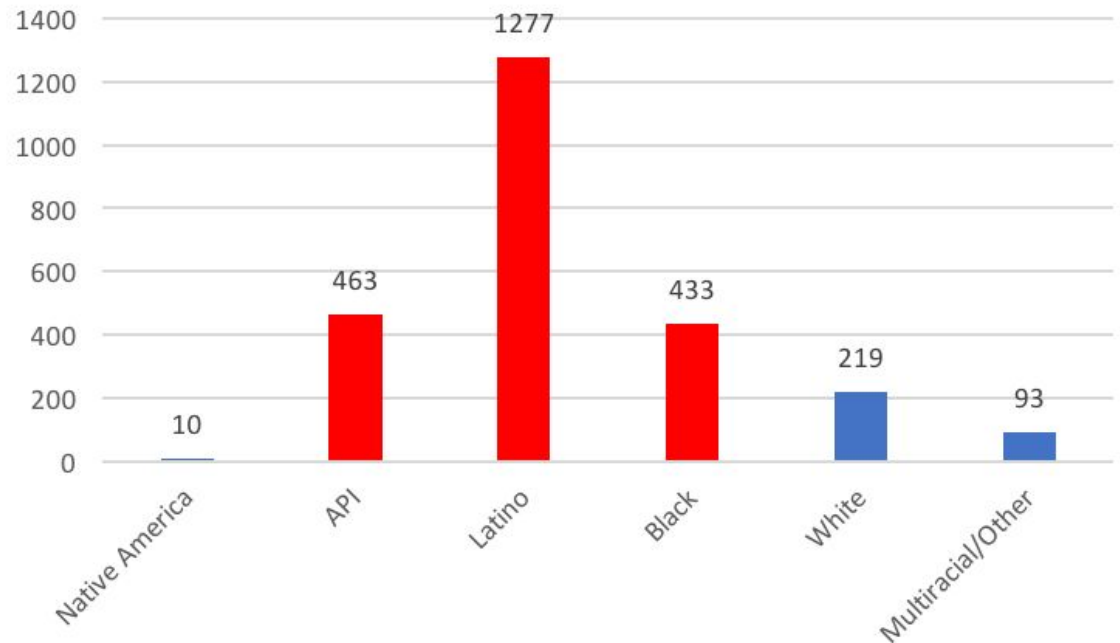

Homeless SFUSD Students by Race/ethnicity, 2015-16



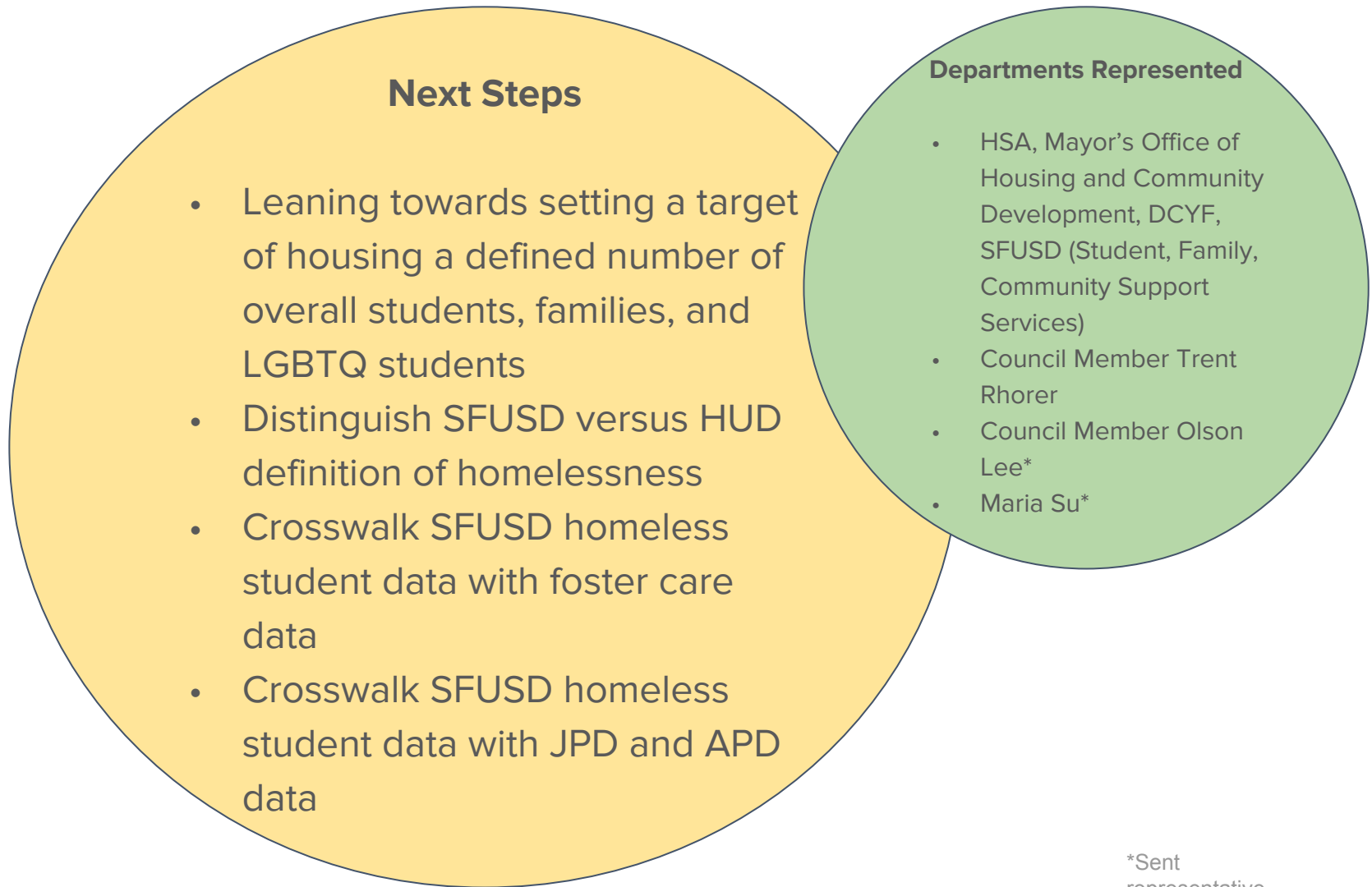
Benchmark: Nearly 4% of all SFUSD students are homeless. Latino, API, and Black students make up the largest number of homeless students.
