

**PREVIEW TO SESSION 5*****Wisdom, Lust and other Dangerous Things:  
Wisdom (and Foolishness) in Solomon's Story (Part 1)*****A. DESCRIPTION**

Solomon's achievement of the throne is marked by shows of power and wisdom. The power is impressive to be sure, but also dangerous. The same might be said of *hokmah*, "wisdom," or "cunning." Only cunning exegetes dare read Solomon's story slowly. Here, all is calm on the surface of the text, but beneath, heavy currents are at work.

**B. TARGETS**

Learners who successfully complete this session will . . .

1. recognize that Solomon was not the expected successor to David's throne.
2. evaluate clues in the text that introduce both certainty and ambiguity into Solomon's succession story.
3. sense both wonder and danger in the literary display of Solomon's unprecedented power.

**C. ASSIGNMENTS**

Before the beginning of this session, all learners must . . .

1. Read 1 Kings 1:1-10:29.
2. Print the worksheet for this session and bring a paper copy of your work to class. It will be collected in the first few minutes of the meeting.
