David Richardson, who passed away in 2015 at the age of 42, grew up in Calgary and was a successful and respected member of Calgary's automotive community. David enjoyed giving back to the city and his community and was always encouraging others to get out and get active.

David started disc golf in 2012 and would play year round two to four times a week... sun, rain or snow. Disc golf gave him not only the physical and strategic challenges of "ball golf" but also strengthened his always powerful connection with nature. He shared his disc golf passion with his beautiful wife Treasure along with their family, friends and dogs.

>> THE DAVID RICHARDSON MEMORIAL DISC GOLF PARK

The proposed 18-hole disc golf course is to be located on a 27-acre site in Calgary's northwest and will be one of the best facilities in North America. It will be the longest disc golf course in the city and, therefore, be well suited as a world class tournament venue!

The park is located on the Parks Foundation Calgary's Rotary-Mattamy Greenway, a world-class outdoor recreational playground. This spectacular course will be accessible to all Calgarians offering an enjoyable outdoor activity for all enthusiasts including novices and families all the way up to professionals and league players.



>> EXCITING FEATURES

- A par-66, 18-hole layout with different sets of tee boxes ranging in length from 4,900 ft. for beginners and families to 8,000 ft. for tournament play
- The longest disc golf course in Calgary with the ability to hold professional tournaments.
- The diverse layout will feature a challenging, long par-5 hole stretching out to 800 ft., and enjoyable par-3's with "hole in one" potential.
- Elevated tees give participants outstanding views of the city and the Rocky Mountains
- Various hazards spread throughout the site include native vegetation and existing water features, adding strategic interest and presenting exciting risks and rewards.



>> WHAT IS DISC GOLF?

Disc golf shares a lot in common with “ball” golf without the expensive tee times, green fees and golf clubs.

Instead of balls and clubs, disc golf uses flying discs. The objective is to throw the disc from the tee box into a basket, in the fewest number of throws possible. As with “ball” golf, terrain, obstacles and accuracy affect the final score. A long drive with a golf ball is 300 yards whereas a long drive with a golf disc is 150 yards.

An estimated 3,000 Calgarians already play disc golf on the existing area courses and The Professional Disc Golf Association has over 95,000 members and runs competitions around the world. Disc golf is one of the fastest growing sports in the city and is open to all participation levels, ages and backgrounds.
