On Second Thought...

For the next several months I would like to use this space to talk about what we Presbyterians call the "doctrines of grace". Some people call them "the five points of Calvinism" but John Calvin did not invent them. They are clearly found in the pages of Holy Scripture. These doctrines systematically explain the true meaning of grace – what the Bible really teaches about sin and salvation.

The first thing to understand when it comes to sin and salvation is that we are *fallen*. Adam and Eve represent all of humanity when they disobey God and seek their own satisfaction and glory. This is what sin is – not doing what God wants but doing what we want. The Bible clearly says in Romans 3 that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

To fall short of something – a goal or a target, for instance – means that we miss that goal or target. This is what the Greek word that Paul uses and that we translate as "sin" means – to miss the target. The Bible teaches that all of us miss the goal God sets for our lives; none of us, not even the best of us, is perfectly obedient. We may try to reach the goal God sets for our lives, but we can't. We don't. We fall short. We miss it.

This is different from what some Christians teach and believe. Some Christians teach that we get partway there, or that we are able to reach part of the goal. They believe that salvation is a cooperative effort. God provides the sacrifice to pay the price of sin while we provide the faith to receive the gift of salvation. They teach that if we want to be saved then we must *choose* to follow Christ, to ask Jesus to come into our heart.

This is not what the Bible teaches. Ephesians 2 tells us we "were dead in [our] transgressions and sins". That is the Reformed understanding. We are dead in our sins. And if we are dead, then there is nothing we can do to save ourselves. Imagine you fall off the roof of the First Tennessee building downtown and land on Gay Street. You would not be able to sit up, pull your phone out of your pocket, and call 911. Why? Because you would be dead. And if you are dead there is nothing you can do to help yourself. This is what it means that we are *fallen*. We cannot do anything to contribute to our own salvation.




This is terrible news! However, it makes the Good News even better. Ephesians 2 goes on to say, "But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in our transgressions – it is by grace you have been saved." Yes, we were dead, but God made us alive. Salvation is an act of God's grace. There is nothing that we do to help God or to choose it. It is a gift, given out of God's love for us. If we are able to open our heart to Christ, it is only because the Lord first opened our heart to receive him. (See Acts 16:14) Our salvation is a work of God, not something we do or we choose.

Now, this doesn't mean we don't have a choice to make. We do. We can choose to be *grateful*. That's the choice we have – to show God our gratitude, or not. God has done something wonderful for us; he has made us alive with Christ. How will we show our gratitude for that gift? Will we dedicate our lives to serving and glorifying him? Will we do our best to do his will? Will we try to be faithful and obedient, knowing that we won't always do it perfectly?

You see, salvation is not something that we choose, and neither is it something we can earn! Our obedience cannot gain or lose our salvation. Our obedience is how we show God how thankful we are. This is Good News, indeed, because none of us is perfectly obedient. We all - all of us - miss the mark. So thanks be to God for his love and grace. Thanks be to God for the gift of our salvation. Now let's go out and show God - and the world - just how grateful we are!

RETURNING TO IN-PERSON ACTIVITIES

Committees, Ministry Units, & Other Groups - Beginning July 1st

The Session has determined that committees, ministry units, Bible studies, Sunday School classes, youth activities, and any other groups of the church may resume in-person meetings beginning July 1st. Meetings may be held either on or off church property, provided proper physical distancing guidelines are observed, including the wearing of face coverings. Outside groups that are not part of the church will also be allowed to use the church building for meetings and gatherings beginning in July, with the same guidelines.

The Church Administrator will assist groups in scheduling meeting rooms so that safe physical distancing may be maintained. Please do not plan a meeting at the church without notifying the Church Administrator. Some groups may not be able to meet at their normal meeting times and the number of groups able to meet on church property simultaneously may be limited. The Church Administrator will have final determination in scheduling church groups.

It is up to each individual group to weigh the risks and make its own determination regarding whether or not to meet. The Session would like to remind groups that just because they are *allowed* to meet in person doesn't mean that they *should* or that they *must* meet in person. Any groups that choose to meet in person should make allowances or opportunities for individuals who fall into high-risk categories, or who do not yet feel comfortable meeting in person, to join the meeting virtually.

Finally, please remember the Five Core Principles: practice physical distancing; wear cloth face coverings when in public and physical distancing can't be achieved; wash hands properly and often; clean surfaces regularly; stay home when sick.

Returning To In-Person Worship

Even though small groups and committees will be allowed to meet at the church beginning in July, we will not return to in-person worship services until **Sunday, August 2nd**. The Session has voted to implement the following guidelines once in-person worship resumes. Please note that these guidelines were agreed upon by the Session and are self-imposed, not out of fear but out of love and for the safety and well-being of anyone choosing to worship at Second Presbyterian Church.

- There will be one worship service at 11:00 a.m. with no attendance limits. The nursery will be open during worship and childcare will be available for children, infant to age 6. We encourage worshipers who fall into one of the high-risk categories for Covid-19 to seriously consider continuing to worship virtually via our live stream on Sunday morning.
- We request that everyone enter and exit the building through the main sanctuary door. Anyone who has difficulty with stairs should be dropped off at the portico and enter through that door. Once you arrive, call the church office and someone will open that door for you to enter.
- We request that worshipers remain in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings unless it is absolutely necessary to visit other parts of the building. Restrooms will be open and available for those needing to use them. Both the sanctuary and the restrooms will be cleaned thoroughly before and after worship, but not during.
- We request that worshipers observe proper physical distancing and refrain from any physical contact with those outside of one's household. Each household is requested to maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet from other households. Pews will be marked to help worshipers maintain this distance and the balcony will be open for those who would like to sit there.


Returning to In-person Worship (Contd.)

- We request that everyone in attendance wear a face covering while in the building. Disposable face coverings will be provided for those who do not have them.
- Offering plates will not be passed during the service but will be placed outside each door to the sanctuary. Hand sanitizer will also be placed at the entrance to the sanctuary, however worshipers are encouraged to bring their own.
- There will be no congregational singing and no chancel choir during worship until further notice.
- We will not celebrate the sacrament of communion until further notice.
- Pastors will not wear face coverings while leading the service and will conduct the worship service from behind the communion table in the chancel area to maintain a safe distance from worshipers. Pastors will not greet people at the entrance to the sanctuary following the service.
- Bulletins will be available for those who desire them. For who do not, communal readings such as the Affirmation of Faith or Prayer of Confession will be projected onto a screen located at the front of the sanctuary.

Weddings & Funerals

Weddings and funerals will be allowed to resume on August 1st with the above guidelines, except that attendance will be limited to 50% of the sanctuary/chapel capacity, depending on the location. Receptions will not be held in the Mary Chambers Room or Fellowship Hall for the remainder of 2020.



July 23rd 5:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.




Come and join us in the parking lot for some physically distant fellowship. We'll have two "savory" food trucks, one serving BBQ, the other Jamaican cuisine.
