On Second Thought...

This month we consider the fifth and final doctrine of the "five points of grace": that we are Held by God. We believe that we are Held by God securely for all eternity. This is the joyous conclusion of the doctrine of salvation.

This has been expressed in different ways by different people:

- Once saved, always saved: We cannot lose our salvation.
- Perseverance of the Saints: We persevere through to the end, through to heaven.
- The Perseverance of God: It is really God who perseveres, not us. God brings us through.
- The Preservation of the Saints: God preserves those whom he chooses. Salvation is God's action, not ours.
- Eternal Security: Our ultimate destiny is certain.

However we express it, the meaning is the same. I do not have to worry about losing my salvation. The end result is not up to me; it's up to God. My eternal destiny is secure because I am Held by God.

This is what Scripture teaches:

In him you, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, which is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it. (Ephesians 1:13-14 NRSV)

We have an inheritance in heaven, we have not yet come to possess it, but we have the guarantee that we will receive it. That guarantee is the presence of the Holy Spirit within us. With that guarantee, we do not have to worry that we might do something to lose our inheritance.

Scripture goes on to say:

You have a pure and enduring inheritance that cannot perish - an inheritance that is presently kept safe in heaven for you. Through his faithfulness, you are guarded by God's power so that you can receive the salvation he is ready to reveal in the last time. (1 Peter 1:4-5 CEB)

We have an inheritance in heaven that is protected and guarded by *God's* faithfulness and power, not ours. Our salvation is dependent upon God's faithfulness, God's power. And as if that isn't enough, we have the promise of God in the words of Jesus, himself:



My sheep listen to my voice. I know them and they follow me. I give them eternal life. They will never die, and no one will snatch them from my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them from my Father's hand. I and the Father are one. (John 10:27-30 CEB)


There is the image right in Scripture - we are Held by God. Forget being in good hands with Allstate, the Bible tells us we are in better hands with God! No one - not even Satan himself - can snatch us out of God's hands. We cannot do anything to lose our salvation.

Paul tells the Romans that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. (Romans 8:39) The reason he is able to give them - and us - this assurance is because our salvation does not depend on us. It depends totally on God. Friends, this is the heart of the Good News.

Sadly, there are many Christians in the world today who do not experience the peace and joy that Jesus Christ brings because they are afraid that they have done or can do something to lose their salvation. They have not been taught the Good News of being Held by God. Rather, they have been taught that their salvation depends on them, on a choice they must make or a prayer they must pray. Further, they have been taught that if they are not perfect, if they "backslide" or lose faith or quit going to church or sin in any way, this will cause them to fall out of God's hand and that they will be in danger of losing their salvation.

This is simply not what the Bible teaches. The Bible teaches that our eternal security does not depend upon us holding on to God, but upon God holding on to us. Just as a father securely holding on to his child's hand keeps her safe when she stumbles, so we are safe when we stumble because of God's loving grip on our lives. This knowledge frees us from worry, fear, and doubt, to live joyfully and gratefully for him in all we do.



All Saints' Day Service of Remembrance and Celebration



ADVENT BEGINS NOVEMBER 29TH



Our theme for Advent this year is *Those Who Dream*... It is inspired by the Revised Common Lectionary passages for Advent (Year B), with particular inspiration coming from Psalm 126: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream."

What does it look like to live as those who dream? The prophets, the psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, the shepherds and the magi – they were all dreamers. They received, discovered, and responded to God's dreams for the world. During Advent, we, too, have the chance to be dreamers, stepping into the mystery and awe of God's dreams as we pray for them to shape our reality.

This series is for those who dream of a deeper connection with God, for those who dream of a better world, for those who dream of comfort, and for those who have given up on their dreams. It is for those whose dreams have been crushed, and for those who show us that dreams take time.

An Advent Devotional will be available in both paper and digital format beginning November 22nd. The first Sunday of Advent is November 29th.

1st Sunday of Advent – *Those Who Dream*...keep awake (hope)

2nd Sunday of Advent – *Those Who Dream*...prepare the way (peace)

3rd Sunday of Advent – **Those Who Dream**...sow joy (joy)

4th Sunday of Advent – *Those Who Dream*...are not alone (love)

Christmas Eve - this night, we are **Those Who Dream**

1st Sunday after Christmas - Those Who Dream...will not keep silent

2nd Sunday after Christmas – *Those Who Dream*...persevere

Notes from the Book Lady:

Many people are out and about. Many of us are not. I have been given some books that you might be interested in reading as we stay at home and stay safe.

A highly acclaimed book from author Eric Larson is *The Splendid and the Vile*. This book is also recommended by Helen Grant, Ed Batts, and Liz Peebles. It deals with the story of Churchill, his family, and happenings during the Blitz. More history comes from author Elaine Weiss - *The Woman's Hour: The Great Fight to Win the Vote*. Reviews say "superb... I got goosebumps" and "political history at its best." Finally, there are two books from Bill O'Reilly and Martin Dugard: *Killing Patton and Killing Jesus*. Both are billed as fast reads.

Two fiction books that are set in World War II Europe. *A Train in Winter* by Caroline Moorehead recounts the extraordinary story of women, friendship, and resistance in occupied France. It is a "Notable Book of the Year" in the New York Times. From the author of Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker, Jennifer Chiaverini, is the novel *Resistance Women*. This takes a different approach to World War II resistance – inside Nazi Germany! The book is inspired by actual events.

Two books dealing with faith are *When God Winks at You* by Squire Rushnell and *The Faith Club* by Ranya Idliby, Suzanne Oliver, and Priscilla Warner. My friend and church member Tammy Akers loaned me her well-used book *When God Winks at You*. I really enjoyed this book, especially at the beginning of Covid-19. So those are two recommendations.

Finally, do you need some jollies? Then I recommend the Sam Venable book *You Gotta Laugh to Keep From Cryin': A Baby Boomer Contemplates Life Beyond Fifty*.

PASTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The Pastors' Discretionary Fund is a fund used by the pastors to assist people in times of difficulty or special need. It provides a discreet and direct way for our pastors to help individuals who are in need, both within and outside of the congregation. It's called the Pastors' Discretionary Fund because the pastors have the discretion to use these funds to help people without having to seek prior approval from a committee or the Session. This allows the pastors to offer immediate help and relief to individuals when needed. To ensure that there is accountability the Treasurer of the congregation must review and approve each check by signature and money is never given directly to individuals. When the pastors use this fund, it is to directly pay companies or entities that will result in helping individuals.

Monies in the fund are donated by individuals in the congregation who desire to help those in need. In recent months this fund has been used to pay for the fumigation of a home infested by bed bugs, to pay the utilities bills of two families whose electricity was going to be turned off, to pay for necessary car repairs so a young man could keep his job, to pay for part of a headstone for a family whose teenage son committed suicide, and to help with mortgage and utilities expenses for a family experiencing loss of income due to injury and due to the pandemic. Thanks to all who have donated to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund in the past year. Your gifts have made a real and tangible difference in the lives of many.
