The Treasurer's Report was given by Kim Lotz and is available in the members' only section of the website. The budget is also available.

Committee Reports

Membership – Debbie Spinks

We now have 120 members. Debbie has distributed an updated membership list. Some corrections are needed. She will make the corrections and re-distribute the list.

Fund Raising – Latitia Nichols

Latitia indicated that there were picture membership directories for sale at the meeting, paperback book covers (donated by Lois Hall) which are darling, AQG pins, a few insulated cups, and name tags are available for order.

There will be a work-day associated with the regular Sit and Sew the Saturday after the guild meeting. It will be held at the Baptist Health SW campus from 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM.

PROGRAM NOTES

It has been raining.

It is raining.

It will rain again SOON!

Which of these statements was NOT true the evening of May 11? It was "It is raining." After days of rain, the clouds cleared and the sun came out just in time for AQG members to spread quilts across the split rail fence of Scott Plantation Settlement for the "Airing of the Quilts and Ice Cream Social." It was thrilling to see our antique and modern quilts displayed in such a traditional way.

For those of you that aren't familiar with Scott Plantation Settlement, it is a collection of 25 exhibits representing plantation history for the first 100 years of Arkansas statehood. It is in Scott, Arkansas on land of the Illallee Plantation, only 12 miles east of Little Rock just off Highway 165. If you've ever gone to Cotham's for a burger, you have been very near by. Seemed like we had just left Little Rock and then we were there. Had great signage so it was very easy to find.

Buildings on the site include the Scott depot, a dog-trot log house, a corncrib, a blacksmith shop, a commissary, a church, a schoolhouse, a doctor's office, tenant houses, and the Big House. The settlement is maintained by Scott Connections, a not-for-profit organization dedicated to preserving the history of farm life – in other words – they love history and buildings just like we love quilts. And, since quilts were part of farm life, our interests fit together well. Several of the Scott Connections members attended and were quite amazed at our quilts. Be sure and attend the AQG June meeting for any last minute updates; and then, see you at Statehouse.


