I know, we probably all have a color wheel of some sort, but some of us, namely me, have never had any discussion about how to use one. I honestly never really took it into consideration when planning my quilts. I just knew what I liked, and what I thought looked good. I didn't think much about primary, secondary, etc., when I thought about picking my colors for a project, I would just go with what I liked. This is all well and good, however, now I need to make a quilt using teal and lavender. Hmmm...what goes with those colors? Guess who is going to pull out the old color wheel and try to figure out some combinations! Thank you, Michelle, for giving me that reminder of tools that I had, but never used! I picked up several ideas about how to focus on color.

Thank you to Kathy Jones for presenting a demonstration of the disappearing pinwheel! She made it look so easy! The pinwheel disappeared into a churndash, hey...I am still working on my churndash challenge, which may become a NQA small quilt donation. Another inspiration that I got from the meeting. You can always pick up some ideas from others!

Next month our guest will be Norma McKinnon from Hickory Hill Quilts in Hot Springs. She will be showing us how to use machine embroidery in quilting projects. My machine has an embroidery feature, I look forward to a program about how I might be able to use it for my quilts.

March will bring us Debbie Caffrey, a nationally known quilter, who will be giving two full day workshops on March 7th and 8th, and she will be giving the program at the March Arkansas Quilters Guild meeting. I look

ARKANSAS QUILTERS GUILD MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING 12 JANUARY, 2015

The Arkansas Quilters Guild met at the North Little Rock Community Center on Monday, January 12, 2015. President Donna Toombs called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm and welcomed everyone to the meeting, noting that we have many exciting things up for AQG in the new year.

Donna asked if everyone had read the minutes of the previous meeting and then asked for a motion to approve the minutes, which was then seconded and passed by affirmative vote.

Treasurer Kim Lotz read the treasurer's report and reported that as of December 31, 2014, the guild has a checking account working balance of \$11,037.34. For the month of December we had income of \$2,651.50, expenses of \$560.35, for a net gain of \$2,091.15.

Lavern Schaap reported on the upcoming NQA Quilt Show which will be June 18-20. A meeting was held January 5 and was a big success with 26 guild members in attendance. NQA officials were in attendance as well. Lavern reported that the online website for the show is up on the NQA site, WWW.NQAQUILTS.ORG. She noted that this is not a juried show and that they will accept up to 400 quilt entries for the show. There are numerous opportunities to volunteer, which can be done via the website. The show will be here in Little Rock for the next five years, with an option for two more. There are also 100 vendor spots available for the show.

Riley Middaugh reported on the National Quilting Day event which will be held on March 21, 2015 as a prelude event for the quilt show. It will be held at Grace Lutheran Church in Little Rock. There is a Facebook page with additional information. This can be a work day for donated quilts, and we can use more volunteers for committees.

Melissa Landreth reported on the quilt challenges that the guild will have for 2015, there will be three. (1) Your Journey – this will be a challenge to create a quilt that illustrates your journey through quilting, open to your own interpretation; (2) Branch Out – Create a quilt using a method you have not done before, such as appliqué, curved piecing, etc.; (3) UFO – Get out those UnFinished Objects and get them completed! There will be prizes for this one of Most Completed, Oldest One Completed, and one random drawing.

Alina Polta and Mary Jane reported on Quilt Arkansas 2015, which will be October 1-3, 2015. They are now taking pre-orders for shirts. There is a good assortment of classes. The website (www.quiltarkansas2015.com) is now up, and registration will begin at next month's guild meeting.

Debbie Spinks reported that 72 members have renewed their membership so far.

Nola Ballinger reported for Community Service and stated that there will be a few kits with the hopes of YOU sewing the pieces together. And if you cannot do

the quilting, surely someone in the guild will do that to help. And another can do the binding. Remember, whoever turns in the quilt gets to be "the name in the hat." Sizes recommended by the lady with Hospice are lap, crib, twin, and in-between. Of course, full size quilts will be accepted as well. They do have folks in Hospice at home. When making crib size you may want to keep it neutral as to print/color, etc. Most likely that size will not go to little ones. The drawings for prizes will be in April, August, and November. For each quilt you donate, your name will go in the hat. More is better, right?

Liz Ketcherside reported for Programs and noted that Norma McKinnon of Hickory Hill Quilts in Hot Springs will be the February program. The March program will be Deb Caffrey, who will also be teaching classes the weekend before the guild meeting. Classes will be \$50 each day, and the registration form will be on the website. The classes will again be at the Southwest Baptist campus.

Donna noted that the newsletter is now password protected with a password of 'aggnews' on the website.

Door prizes were called out by hostesses Kathy Jones and Sharon Wiensinger. Winners were Riley Middaugh, Geannine Ott, Sherry Dodds, and Phyllis Westerfield. We had two guests in attendance, Deanna Shafer and Bonetta Hollis, and there were 59 members present.

Show and tell was presented by Eddie Landreth, who displayed a king size quilt made using the Disappearing Hourglass pattern with lines of William Morris fabrics. Jim Gatling who displayed a redwork quilt with blocks embroidered by Joan Beard that was quilted by Eddie Landreth. Judy Pearlstein showed a baby quilt in a split rail fence pattern. Lois Hall showed a Bull's Eye quilt that she made at an AWOL retreat. Jan Partain showed a quilt named "Goal!" in a criss cross pattern that is for her niece in Dallas who just got her Phd – a doctor in the family! Elaine Green showed a quilt named "Butterflies" and said that her sister brought the batik fabrics and pattern from Hawaii. Pat Crawford showed her quilt named "Orange Crush" and said that it began with a package of fabric that was Sarah Zigenbein's that she purchased in 2010, then took to sit and sews at Ferndale and slowly worked on it. It was machine quilted by Eddie Landreth and she completed the binding January 10, 2015. Riley Tyler show a garage sale quilt top that she bought in Mountain View for \$1 and then hand quilted.

After a short break, the guild resumed for the program for the evening.

JANUARY PROGRAM – COLOR TOOLS FOR QUILTERS

Michelle Jones is an accomplished quilter from Hot Springs. Her work has been shown in New York, Paducah, and Ft. Collins, Colorado, as well as Little Rock and Hot Springs. She has won ribbons in machine quilting and art quilts, even winning one for wearable art at the Dubai Quilt Guild Show, Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

Michelle's job in a fabric shop has convinced her that one of the biggest problems quilters have is how to pick the right colors.

She shared several useful tips for making good color choices.

- * A **color wheel** shows the hues, tints, tones and shades of fabric. Michelle showed a vest she'd made that combined shades and hues that she said didn't play well together (although it looked good to me!) and the difference the background color made in a dahlia wallhanging.
- * A design wall is essential. No matter how good the combinations look when they're spread on a bed, they can really look different when they're vertical.
- * A digital camera is useful to see the entire quilt.
- * Other tools that provide perspective are **reducing glasses**, **peep holes** from the hardware store, and the "wrong" end of **binoculars**.
- * Joan Wolfrom's **Three in One Color Tool** are red glasses that show the values of every color but red, and green glasses that show the values of reds.
- * Selvages are easy to take with you to the store. The little colored dots on them are dye registration marks and contain the different colors in the material.
- * Collages are a nifty way to get the general impression of colors you like in a magazine picture of a landscape, room, or other setting. Just cut up the page and rearrange the shapes so the objects aren't identifiable but the colors are presented.
- * Books that Michelle recommended are *Color Play* by Joan Wolfrom and *Color and Design* by Heather Thomas.

Don't know about you, but I'm looking for a magazine to tear up now!

WHAT MARCEL AND PRISCILLA REPORTED

Still need to get more quilt entries. Remember this is a non-juried show. The first 400 quilt entries will be accepted. Enter the SewBatik Challenge. Enter the "Down By the Riverside" challenge. Quilts will be received by Historic Arkansas Museum during the week prior to the show. Enroll in some of the 63 classes. When you enroll in a class, your registration fee is also your entrance for the run of the show. Special Events: Wednesday - Ice Cream Social to hear who the award winners are and a quick preview of the vendor booths and quilts, Thursday – Dinner with a speaker (Judy Martin), Friday – Little Quilt Auction. Quilt must be equal to or less than 30" by 30". Funds raised will support the NQA Grants Program. Local vendors - You are welcome to bring business cards and/or brochures for a display table at the show. It is up to you to resupply as needed. Parking will be available in two decks near the convention center for \$5 per day. 
