ARKANSAS QUILTERS GUILD MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING 8 DECEMBER, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President, Donna Toombs, at 6:35 PM. Donna began the meeting with the introduction of the 2015 officers. They are Donna Toombs, President; 1st VP - Membership, Debbie Spinks; 2nd VP - Quilt Arkansas, Alina Polta; Secretary, Sally Burrup, and Treasurer, Kim Lotz. Committee chairmen known at meeting time are: Community Service - Nola Ballinger; Fund-Raising - Latitia Nichols; Hostess - Marilyn Bradley with committee members Sharon Weinsinger and Kathy Jones; Newsletter - Jackie Bibbs; NQA Liaison - Lavern Schaap; Program Notes - Lavern Schaap, Jan Partain, and Bo Mittelstaedt; Property - Shelia Simpson; Quilt Show/Exhibit - Mary Jane Beard and Judy Young; Sunshine - Judy Young.

Help is still needed with the following committees: AWOL, Public Relations, Newsletter and Ads. Jackie Bibbs is willing to take an Apprentice for the newsletter!

Treasurer's Report – Kim Lotz

Checking Balance – \$9,127.37; Outstanding checks – (\$181.18); Petty Cash – \$100.00; Sarah CD – \$5,026.29; CD – \$9,516.32; Working Balance – \$8,946.19; Income for November – \$768.00; Expenses for November – \$855.13; Net Expense – \$87.13.

The proposed budget for 2015 was published in the December newsletter. A motion was made and seconded to accept the budget as published.

Cookbooks and NQA Update – Lavern Schaap

Lavern reported that 276 cookbooks have been sold. Lavern had some available at the meeting wrapped for holiday giving (at no extra charge!).

Susan Williams will be the Secretary/Treasurer for the NQA Committee. Riley Middaugh will coordinate our National Quilting Day activities. She is hoping to be able to use the stage at Park Plaza Mall for the event. Lavern noted that her copy of the NQA Quilting Quarterly magazine arrived the day of the meeting. It contains the annual quilt design; this could be used in some way for our event. The magazine also contains information about the 2015 show and facts about Little Rock. Check out the NQA website for other information which is continually being added.

Lavern also noted that \$500 was allocated in the 2015 budget for our sponsorship of the NQA annual event. One disappointment – we will not be able to have a raffle quilt. Shannon Young had volunteered to coordinate this. Thank you to Shannon!

The next NQA meeting will be on Monday, January 5, 2015, at the Whole Hog on Cantrell. Two of the NQA Board members are coming to Little Rock to meet with us. The meeting will start at 6:00 PM.

Latitia Nichols, Chairman for our guild booth at the NQA event needs volunteers!

There will be a second meeting on Thursday of the same week – January 8th. It will be a joint meeting of

the National Quilting Day group (Riley's team) and the Booth sub-committee (Latitia's team). Your fearless secretary failed to note the location and time of the meeting. A reminder e-mail will be sent to the guild membership and will contain the details.

BOM and Quilt Arkansas – Alina Polta

Alina showed her completed Turkey block for November and also the Christmas Tree block for the month of December.

Alina had a sample Quilt Arkansas shirt to show the group. They are good quality denim shirts and will be on sale at the next meeting. There will be sample shirts to try on for sizing. Payment is expected at the time of order and will be right around \$25.

Membership – Debbie Spinks We now have 130 members.

Community Service - Nola Ballinger

Our guild donated 37 quilts to tornado victims from the spring tornado in the Mayflower/Vilonia area. We donated through three groups: The Vilonia United Methodist Church, Catholic Charities, and the Mayflower public schools. One quilt was donated to an individual, a woman who was picked up physically thrown by the storm. Miraculously, she was not injured. Those present to make the donations were able to locate this woman and give her one of the quilts. Nola thanked the group for their willingness to participate.

Nola told the guild of plans for 2015 (she is continuing as our Community Service Committee Chair). We will work with Hospice Home Care. Their program includes 35 in-patient beds and they average assisting about 70-75 folks during a year. Recommended quilt sizes are lap, crib size, and twin size. Fleece blankets are welcome. Nola is planning on taking quilts to them on a quarterly basis unless there is enough to warrant more frequent deliveries. Prizes will again be given to guild members who participate. Drawings will be held is April, August, and November.

Fund-Raising – Pat Crawford

Pat thanked the group for a great year!

Quilt Exhibit – Mary Jane Beard

The Terry Library wanted to have an informal voting on the quilt exhibit to add interest to our display. Results are: 4th place was a tie between Debbie Spinks and Alina Polta. 3rd place was our own Exhibit leader, Mary Jane Beard. 2nd place was garnered by Shirley Clark and 1st place in the voting was Susi Olson for her Rainbow creation. Liz thanked everyone for their donations for the auction. Our January program will be Michele Jones from Hot Springs who will talk about Color Tools. Michele is affiliated with Hickory Hill Quilts in Hot Springs Village. Norma McKinnon from Hickory Hill Quilts will provide the February program with her subject being how to incorporate embroidery into quilts. Debbie Caffrey will be our National speaker in March. Sign-up sheets for Debbie's classes will be available in January.

Liz called Eddie Landreth up to present a gift to our wonderful president, Donna Toombs. It is a Signature block quilt done in bright colors with a white background. It was designed by Leah Sample. There are still some blocks available for signing if guild members had not yet provided a signature.

Show and Tell

Beverly Phillips had a tale. Her twin boy grandsons will be born the morning after our meeting bringing them to a grand total of 8 grandchildren! Donna Toombs showed her gift quilt. Jan Partain showed us "What Are You Doing Here?" It is a landscape challenge showing climate change comes to Scotland and it is her own design. It contained a cartoon landscape of Scotland with pebbles from Loch Lomond and hand-made porcelain buttons from Isle of Skye. There are two birds on the quilt; a Puffin (a Northern bird) talking to a Parrot (a Southern bird). Toni Baker showed us her quilt called Duck Duck Goose for a friend who is really into hunting and the outdoors. The colors requested were blue, sand and brown. It was quilted by Eddie Landreth.

Shannon Young showed her completed BOM Sampler from Pinwheel Fabrics for 2014. It is a Civil War reproduction. Sharon Weinsinger brought Peace Cottage which was a landscape challenge. It won 3rd place in the challenge competition. It was quilted by Eddie Landreth. Like Jan's, it was to contain a bird and a tree. Sharon depicted her bird by using a Flying Geese block. Jackie Bibbs showed us Best Wishes which is a Signature block pattern she made for her nephew's wedding (last July). Jackie gave a hint to always use pigment-based ink for photos included in quilts. Susi Olson showed us a Frozen-themed quilt that included snowflakes. It was made for her great-niece in Ohio.

There being no further business, the business portion of the meeting was adjourned so those present could enjoy the holiday refreshments and get ready for the auction.



The NLRCC is located at 2700 Willow in North Little Rock which is near the I-30/I-40 interchange. Get off I-30 or I-40 at JFK. Go south to Pershing Boulevard. Turn right. Follow Pershing to Willow. It's on the right facing the new Patrick Hays Senior Citizen's Center.
