#### ARKANSAS QUILTERS GUILD MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING 8 FEBRUARY, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Alina Polta.

**Minutes**: Request was made for any corrections or additions to January minutes but none offered. Move was made by Sally Burrup, and seconded by Eva Harrison, to approve the minutes as written/available in the computer. Vote was made to approve minutes.

**Treasurer's Repor**t: Copies of the report were made available to all members present. Treasurer Kim Lotz reviewed the report.

#### **Committee Reports**

**AWOL**: Eddie and Melissa Landreth, Jim Gatling, and Sally Burrup, Co- Chairs, reported that AWOL is scheduled for March 18-20 and currently there are 33 members registered to attend with 7 vacancies still available; however the final date to register – and pay all dues – is March 1st. Registration form is on the website and can be downloaded, completed, and submitted electronically. At the AWOL there will be fat quarter fabric exchanges as well as games that may also require fat quarters to participate. There will be three rooms for sewing and reminder was made that Ferndale provides free liquids while the quilters usually bring snacks.

Due to a conflict of dates with AWOL, the Guild voted to cancel the Sit and Sew for March. Sit and Sew is held in the old South West hospital cafeteria between 8am and 5 pm monthly on the third Saturday.

**Challenges**: Desi Gibson, Beverly Phillips, Lynn Fletcher, and Donna Toombs reviewed the Challenge for 2016: to either (1) use the same quilt pattern with different fabric choices, or (2) to use the same fabric choices in different quilt patterns.

Community Service: Alicia Bell, Chair, stated that she purchased and pre-cut fabric for six kits to make a 9-Patch quilt. She stated that 3 quilts have already been donated (from Beverly, Shannon, and Alina) for the children in THE CALL, a foster care program. The goal is to create 37-40 quilts. The Guild discussed using the Sit and Sew on 3rd Saturday meetings scheduled Feb 20 and March 14 to cut additional fabric and create more packages. Eddie Landreth has graciously volunteered to assist with doing the long-arm quilting and binding.

**Demo/Vendors**: Donna Toombs, Chair, led her first inservice on basic quilting techniques. She used "Wickedly Easy Quilt Patterns" and had hand-outs of the information available for all. She requested additional volunteers to present demonstrations at the Guild meetings aimed toward being educational for new

quilters and a solid review for quilters who are more advanced.

**Fundraising**: Boneta Hollis, Chair. Her favorite store for creating name tags or luggage tags has closed so she is starting over checking other stores that do printing jobs. Ideas were offered:

- \* Sell items purchased from Jack the Ripper, who creates magnetic seam rippers available with/without attached necklace. The price will be \$33 and various colors should be available.
- \* T-shirt with "Quilter press to the dark side" was demonstrated to all and discussed. They only come in black but a variety of sizes are available. The cost will be \$22 each.
- \* Betty's crockpot roast and rolls were served as an example of the wonderful recipes that are in the Guild cookbook and several are still available.

Hostess: Judy Stewart & Sally Burrup, Co-Chairs, announced that there were 58 members and 8 guests present at the guild meeting. They also encouraged everyone to check out the "freebies" at the front of the room. Five prizes of fat quarters were donated. Four door prizes were awarded to Bonita Hillis, Tama Brudette, Susie Olsen, and Eva Harrison. Bright name tags are now being provided to visitors. Fabric exchanges will be done at each meeting: but using a variety of sizes (fat quarters one month, 4 inch squares the next, etc.). A Challenge will be made for members to create a quilt or other item using the fabric from the fabric exchange. The meaning of a Knot was discussed and members were requested to help create lists of current Knots with special emphasis upon which Knots are accepting new members. Names of members who wish to consider creating a new Knot were also requested.

**Membership**: Mary Jane Beard, Chair. Currently there are 99 paid members for 2016 as compared to 137 in 2015. The goal is to have 160 paid members—which is 61 additional members. The Guild will begin the use of awards for those who bring a guest by giving out a special safety pin tag with the AQG symbol on it, followed by a special charm award to the member whose guest actually joins the Guild.

**Newsletter Ads/PR**: Eddie Landreth has been assisting with this but a Chair would be appreciated.

demonstrations. Lavern agreed to set up a table with forms to give to visitors who request information about quilts/quilt history. Jackie Bibbs, Sammie Sue Harrell, and Donna Toombs will be offering demonstrations on basic information about quilting.

Programs & Workshops: Lavern Schaap & Debbie Spinks, Co-Chairs, reminded everyone of the Dawn Heese workshops March 12 and 13 and that there still are openings. If the workshops do not fill at the AQG meeting, they would like to contact other Guilds regarding registration availability for the workshops. Price is \$50 for one class and \$80 for both. A program guide for 2016 was provided to all.

**Property**: No Chair/no report.

Quilt Arkansas 2017: Angie Heifner, Chair. Date has been set for September 7-10, 2017 (first weekend of the month) and will be held in Ferndale. The theme will be "Raining Cats and Dogs." Shirley Clark created very excellent Excel programs for the registration, payment of fees, etc., last year. She was kind enough to share those programs for use again. A volunteer familiar with Excel is needed to run the programs and help with Quilt Arkansas. If interested, please contact Angie. Angie also passed out to all a 6 question survey requesting information about things people liked/would like at the event.

Quilt Show/Exhibit: Chair position vacant. Mary Jane Beard stated she has a need for people to assist with demonstrations at Terry Library during October-November. She is hoping that Ribbon prizes be made again to give as awards. There will be two exhibit cases at the Quilt show and she would appreciate ideas of what people think might be interesting to place in the cases.

**Sunshine**: Shannon Young, Chair, requested that members inform her of events/illness/etc., in order for her to know of the need to contact that member.

**Website**: The webmaster is in process of updating/correcting the website, especially some links that are inoperable and the AQG 101.

**New Business**: Additional discussion made led by Mary Jane Beard about using the AQG meeting room before the meeting for working on community service projects or your own projects since there would be no additional charge (AQG already is paying for the room for the day).

Request was made for a volunteer to do the minutes for the Programs.

Jim Gatling showed a heavy duty non-stick oven liner that he was shown by Sue that works very well for fusible applique. It is available at Walmart for \$9 a box.

13th Annual Spring Fling Shop Hop brochures were shown. March 31, April 1st and 2nd.

#### **Show and Tell**

Melissa Landreth displayed "Orange Peel," a quilt based on the Missouri Star Quilt pattern that took her over a year to make as had much hand applique of bright colors on a white background. She stated shock that her husband quilted it for her! She also showed her work from being snowed in – four fabric envelopes she created from a video only (possibly from Shabby Fabrics).

Karen Fite had a beautiful Peacock quilt made from fabric from Bed-warmer Quilt and Sew store in Benton near the Tinseltown Center. She stated that there will be classes for this pattern March 7th or 12th. In addition, she made a black, white, and gold colored quilt called "Take 5" that she stated was easy to make and was also made with fabric from Bed-warmer Quilt and Sew store.

Meg Cullum's grandmother used double-knits to make "Grandma's Building Blocks" quilt before she entered hospice. Grandma passed away on January 7th and Meg plans to finish it as it will be the only quilt that they made together.

Alina Polta used a pattern from Craftsy to help her make a table topper with a Valentine's theme. "My Funny Valentine" had lots of hearts in the center and will be a lovely party centerpiece.

**Cindy Barszczewski** completed a block of the month pattern by Lynett Jenson called "Thimble Berry Barn" because she needed a quilt with a theme from the past. Due to time constraints, she used embroidery floss to hand quilt it.

**Robin Tyler** showed "Spinning Stars," a red, white, and blue quilt that she started last fall at a retreat and finished for a Christmas present for her son.

**Sue Womack** made a blue, green, and brown colored quilt called "Josephine's Knot" in a class with Debbie Maddy, that is intended for her daughter Cassandra.

**Pam Brown** made a Log Cabin Arkansas Traveler using reds and golds that she stated she started with a group at a retreat at Robert's Carriage House and they all decided to make a log cabin quilt. That was a perfect chance for her since she had never made one. She stated she started it last November and finished in January! Carol Hurt quilted her quilt.

Bonita Hollis completed a baby quilt using the interesting material that was supplied for her by the lady who requested the quilt. She named the quilt "Gaston's Quilt for Ally" as the navy and coral fabric has an overall print of antlers and arrows (remember Gaston in Beauty and the Beast who used antlers in all of his decorations).

#### FEBRUARY PROGRAM

Jim Gatling introduced Carolyn Eastham, the wife of retired Ambassador Alan Eastham. Carolyn and her children accompanied the Ambassador to State Department posts in numerous locations overseas and she volunteered on many projects.


Ms. Eastham said the closest she came to making a quilt was in Nepal when she obtained a booklet and some Indian fabric that was cut to use in a quilt but was given, unfinished, 20 years later to some Nuns for them to complete.

Quilts: Jim Gatling displayed a quilt he entered into the "Art in the Embassy" project intending that it belong to Carolyn. Instead, it was hung in the Embassy until returned to him via an armored truck! Ms. Eastham and Jim pieced, and Marilyn Weaver did the long-arm work, on a quilt depicting the U.S. flag. It was a favorite background in many countries for dignitaries posing for pictures. Her third quilt shown was one with the label "Malawi" across the top; which interprets into 'Warm Heart of Africa' and was guilted by Mary Warner. Quilting was a new concept to African people as they did not extensively use fabric but rather used bark, plants, and animal skins for clothing, etc. Carolyn explained the differences between batik fabrics made in in Dutch wax (VLISCO) method vs that made in Africa vs. that recently available from China.

Malawi: Malawi is in the interior of Africa and Dr. Livingstone was once there, so a connection still exists with Scotland. Livingstone University was named in his honor. There are about 11 million people in Malawi and corn is the staple crop although the main cash crop is tobacco. A native clothing item is the Chi tang, a 2 yard length of fabric worn in various ways that shows a printed picture demonstrating affiliation with specific groups/church/stores such as a gas station/products, can show the year's calendar, or can even be used to commemorate a person (think about your face emblazoned across someone's rear end!). The main clothing source is the 'used clothing market' started in 1976 with clothing donations from charity groups like Goodwill, to sell overseas. Chinese clothing is reportedly cheaper but US and European clothing is cheaper and of better quality.

**Volunteer work**: Medical care in Malawi is extremely basic. Ms. Eastham stated that she assisted in raising funds to provide a bicycle to a midwife who traveled to various mobile clinics. Her charity groups included creating birthing kits of very basic supplies that hospitals did not have of their own.

She also volunteered at a Feeding Center run by Spanish Nuns, the Ministry of Hope Nursery with AIDs babies, and an orphanage built by Mother Theresa. She was very proud of her "charm school" designed to instruct the Embassy staff on the proper way to assist visiting Dignitaries. Ms. Eastham's current enterprise is teaching a Manners and Etiquette course for children and adults.


