ARKANSAS QUILTERS GUILD MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING 12 DECEMBER, 2016

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Alina Polta.

Minutes: One correction was submitted regarding the dates of the Quilt Show – please see that section below for correct information of its closing. No other corrections or additions to minutes were offered. A move was made, and seconded, to approve the minutes as corrected. The vote passed to approve the minutes as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: Copies of the report were made available to all members present and Treasurer Kim Lotz reviewed the report.

Committee Reports

Programs & Workshops: A teacher has confirmed for April's meeting.

Challenges: Ms. Dodd will be Chair for 2017 and she will be providing a piece of fabric each month that participants are to use, in any manner that they choose, to create a 12 ½ inch block. These blocks will eventually be used to make charity quilts.

Quilt Show/Exhibit: Mary Jane Beard and Judy Young, Chairs: Ms. Beard reminded everyone that the quilts at the Quilt show will be taken down tomorrow starting at 9 am. There were more than 700 votes counted. Prizes were awarded to:

1st place Pam Davis, "Delightsome Seasons" 2nd place Alicia Bell, "A Lot of Pink" 3rd place Sue Womack, "My Arkansas"

Membership: Mary Jane Beard, Chair, announced that there are currently 125 paid members for the year of 2016. For the year 2017, there are already 33 paid members.

Fundraising: Boneta Hollis, Chair, proudly shared that the auction is tonight!

Community Service: Alicia Bell, Chair, happily proclaimed that the Guild was given 3 additional quilts tonight, making a total of 75 completed quilts for The Call (a group supporting foster care in Arkansas). She stated that additional pre-cut fabric kits have been made for next year. Those who donated a quilt had been given a ticket and tonight Alicia used those tickets for a drawing and she awarded prizes to:

New business: President Polta thanks the 2016 Officers for their service. She shared that there are still some positions in need of a volunteer: Photographer, Property, and Program Notes.

SHOW AND TELL

Liz Ketcherside thanked the guild for their support and stated that she appreciated their thoughts and kindnesses.

Bonita Hollis brought her "Ha Bum Bug" quilt she started during the Hissy Fitz workshop. She shared that years ago her son David wrote on a child's bookcase and blamed it on his little sister, although she was unable to write yet. He wrote "Katy is a Bumbug"! Bonita also created Collage of Courage for her friend Alice, who had 20 consecutive years of T-shirts for the Race for the Cure Runs. Alice's Survivor Shirts are on the back of the quilt

Jan Partain used tan and brown fabrics in a 'masculine' quilt.

Lois Hall used the disappearing 9 patch pattern to make a quilt for Lucas, her niece's baby boy who has born prematurely and was just released from the hospital. They live in northern Indiana and it gets pretty cold there in the winter so Lois chose fleece for the backing for warmth and tied it together. The toddler sized quilt is composed of pastel blues, greens, and yellows.

Date Balls

2 sticks of butter or margarine

1 cup sugar

8 oz. pkg of chopped dates

2 cups Rice Krispies 1 t. vanilla 1 c. chopped pecans powdered sugar

Combine margarine, dates and sugar in saucepan and cook until thick. Remove from heat.

Add Rice Krispies, nuts, and vanilla and mix well. Cool. Make into balls and roll in powdered sugar.


